

STAFF REPORT

Topic: Request to change the designated no parking area on Wentworth Cove Road

Discussion: At the April 26, 2021, the City Council voted to table this item.

Last year City Council approved Councilor Felch's request to designate a portion of Wentworth Cove Road a no parking area. City Council approved a no parking area on both sides of the road. The Council approved a no parking area on the odd numbered side from the southern boundary of 65 Wentworth Cove Road to the northern boundary of 91 Wentworth Cove Road. On the even side of the road, it was from the southern boundary of 66 Wentworth Cove Road to the northern boundary of 88 Wentworth Cove Road.

The residents have requested a change and Councilor Felch supports their request to change the designated no parking area. Public Works proposes to eliminate the no parking designation on the west (even numbered) side of the Wentworth Cove Road and designate the east side (odd numbered side) of the Road a no parking area from the northern edge of the Summit Ave right of way to the southern edge of the Woodvale Road right of way.

Fiscal Impact: The estimated cost to install the necessary signs to implement this no parking area is \$100 as we will reuse the signs that were already installed on Wentworth Cove Road. The cost of the signs will come from the Public Works' regulatory sign budget.

Recommendation: City Council void all existing designated no parking areas on Wentworth Cove Road and designate the east side (odd numbered side) of the road a no parking area from the northern edge of the Summit Ave right of way to the southern edge of the Woodvale Road right of way.
