Trailers!**

With the arrival of fall and cooler temperatures, people will soon be needing to store their "toys" that require trailers. The City's Zoning Enforcement office would like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten from one season to the next.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which includes trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.](#))

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be located.

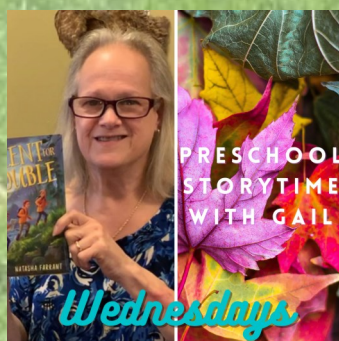

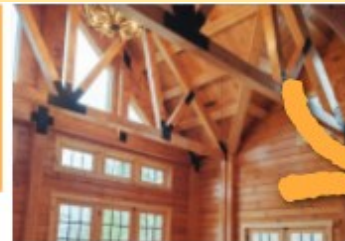

Powerhouse announces more auditions for A Christmas Carol!

Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative is excited to announce additional auditions for December's co-production of Joel Mercier's A Christmas Carol: The Musical Ghost Story. Produced in conjunction with NCCA at Jean's Playhouse, the 2021 production is hoped to be the beginning of an annual tradition of bringing the beloved Dickens' classic to the Lakes Region.

Auditions will be held on the third floor of the Belknap Mill on Sunday, October 3rd. Kids and teens ages 6 and up are asked to come at 2:00 pm. Adults will sign up for slots beginning at 4:00 pm.

For those interested who cannot attend on the 3rd, video submissions will be accepted. There is a \$25 participation fee, but nobody will be turned away from the cast if this presents a hardship. Directed by Mercier and featuring his original music and lyrics, the majority of the cast has been in place since last Spring, but there are several additional roles to fill for adults, and room to cast 10-15 children and teens to play the Cratchit kids and ensemble. Adult roles available include Scrooge, the Ghost of Christmas Past, Bob Cratchit, Nephew Fred, Mr. Fezziwig, Topper & Mrs. Topper, as well as the third member of the "ghostly" dance trio.

Says Mercier, "This production is the true definition of an ensemble cast. Everyone has a lot to do and everyone plays a specific character in the ensemble, while also doubling as traditional characters in the story, such as Fezziwig, the School Master, Mrs. Dilber, Old Joe, etc."



Rehearsals will begin October 24th and continue Sunday afternoons and Tuesday and Thursday evenings at the Belknap Mill. Vaccinations are required for all participants over 12, and masks may be worn at some or all rehearsals depending on the levels of community transmission.

Participants need to be prepared to be patient and flexible.

Performance dates are scheduled for December 17th - 19th, 2021 at the beautiful Colonial Theatre.

Laconia Nonprofits Celebrate Our Town!

Inspired by Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative's November production of Thornton Wilder's *Our Town*, several Laconia nonprofits have come together to create an interactive program of events for the community which celebrate Laconia. Called "Celebrate Our Town - Laconia", Powerhouse and the Belknap Mill will team up with Celebrate Laconia, Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Library offering seven weeks of programs that explore the arts, culture, and history in Laconia.

Says Karen Prior, Executive Director of the Belknap Mill, "As we were thinking of the themes of Wilder's masterpiece and how it celebrates a small NH community, we thought it would be nice to reach out to other local groups and brainstorm ways we could collaborate to expand the impact of each organization to share in the celebration of our small NH community."

Bookended by Powerhouse's November 19-21 production at the Colonial and its January 7-9 workshop at the Belknap Mill of a new musical which shares many of the same themes of *Our Town*, the "Celebrate Our Town" events will include the Mill hosting art exhibits of Laconia inspired art from community members and Laconia students as well as three new works of art produced by its Artist-in-Residence Larry Frates with help from community members.

The Mill will also host an exhibit on some of Laconia's history put together by the Laconia Historical and Museum Society. The Library will host a discussion about the play, as well as feature works of local writers. Celebrate Laconia will be working on an online component where people can share stories and more about life in Laconia. There is a webpage (<https://www.belknapmill.org/celebrate-our-town>) set up to share details on all the events as well as information as to how the community can participate by sharing their artwork and stories. Initial confirmed events are already populated on the page and more will be added over time so check back.

The first thing people can do who want to participate in the art exhibit is to contact Larry Frates via the website to find out how to join the painting fun, or to contact Jaylene Bengtson who is curating the art work submitted by community members. Tickets are already on-sale for the *Our Town* production via the Colonial Theatre's website, and patrons can sign up to attend the free discussion at the Library on December 1st. Seating is limited.

Says Bryan Halperin, Powerhouse producer and director of *Our Town*, "There are 40 local individuals involved in the production of *Our Town*, but we know there are many more people out there who want to help us celebrate Laconia and can contribute stories and art work, and more or who will want to view the online content and attend the exhibits and discussions or theatre performances. This collaboration between community nonprofit organizations to celebrate our town is a way to show the City, donors and volunteers of the various organizations that the time, effort and funds committed to these groups produces benefits that the whole community can enjoy together."

As with any public events during this time, Covid could have an impact on the live events. People should check the website for updates on Covid safety precautions and for the possibility of some of the events becoming virtual.

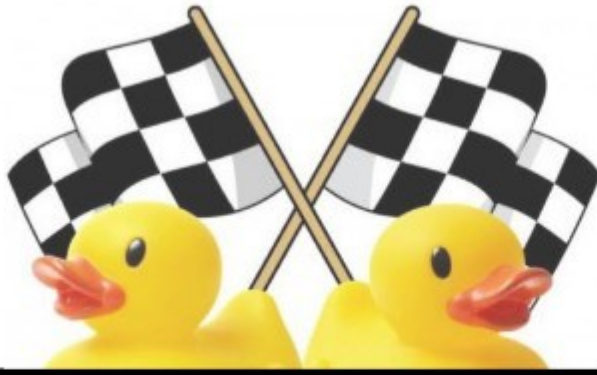

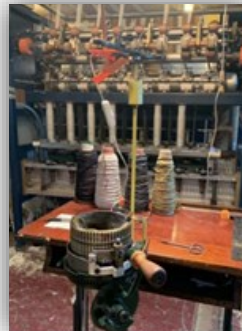

Early in the development of the 'McIntyre Circle' area, the Charles C. Rogers Co. Inc. was a tenant in this building at the western end of the Lake Shore Road, moving there in late May 1955. The cinder block structure had been built in 1951-1952 and was occupied by the Laconia Supply Co. prior to Rogers. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)

Another longtime occupant of the building was Matheson's Floor Coverings and Carpets, which closed in June 1987. National Video and Movie Mania were located there in the 1990s. The building was replaced in late November 2003 by a CVS Pharmacy, which relocated from Wal-Mart Plaza, to the east. 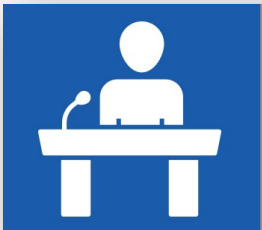
