Wednesday, October 13



Welcome Back! What better way to celebrate socializing again than with murder, secrets, and lies! Join us for an afternoon discussion of "The Keeper of Lost Things" by Ruth Hogan. *Anthony Peardew is the keeper of lost things.*

Forty years ago, he carelessly lost a keepsake from his beloved fiancée, Therese. That very same day, she died unexpectedly. Brokenhearted, Anthony sought consolation in rescuing lost objects—the things others have dropped, misplaced, or accidentally left behind—and writing stories about them. Now, in the twilight of his life, Anthony worries that he has not fully discharged his duty to reconcile all the lost things with their owners. As the end nears, he bequeaths his secret life's mission to his unsuspecting assistant, Laura, leaving her his house and all its lost treasures, including an irritable ghost.



DONATION GUIDELINES

The Laconia Public Library appreciates the generosity of persons that donate materials to the library. However, to maintain a quality collection for all we have established some basic guidelines.

The Library will happily accept the following materials in **good to excellent** condition:

- Hardcover and paperback books - 5 years old or newer
- Music CDs - in good condition and in original packaging
- Books on CD - in good condition and in original packaging
- DVDs - in good condition and in original packaging

The Library does not accept:

- Condensed Books
- Magazines
- Textbooks
- Videos
- Encyclopedia sets
- Books on cassette

All donated material becomes the property of the Laconia Public Library. The Library reserves the right to sell, or otherwise discard materials as we so choose.

There is a limit of four bags or boxes accepted at one time. All donated materials must be delivered to the library.

If requested, an acknowledgement of donation will be provided. A listing of donated items and/or monetary value for the items donated will not be provided.
