



**New Hampshire's Ten Year
Transportation Plan
Public Hearing – 7:00 pm
October 27, 2021
Laconia City Hall
City Council Chambers**



The NH Department of Transportation will hold a public hearing for the Lakes Region on the State's Transportation Ten Year Plan for the years 2023 to 2032.

The ten year plan is the method the State uses to determine which projects are funded for the ten years of the plan. This includes funding for the State's road system as well as those programs that support Laconia such as State Municipal Bridge Aid and the Transportation Alternatives Program. The State Municipal Bridge Aid funds 80% of the projects required to rehabilitate and replace bridges. Without this funding Laconia's taxpayers would have to fund all of the costs associated with major bridge projects. The Transportation Alternative Program funds projects such as bicycle and multiuse trails as sidewalk projects.



Work has now resumed at the Court Street bridge. Please see below for an update on the project's progress:

Drainage has been completed on the north and south sides of the bridge. Temporary water service was put in place last week and installation of the new water line is scheduled to begin.



The bridge closure dates have been adjusted to the week after Columbus Day, and are from Monday, October 18 to Friday, November 19. During the bridge closure, Route 3 bypass will be used as the detour route. Temporary traffic signals will be used to assist vehicles turning left or right onto Route 106 from the Route 3 Bypass off-ramp.

Following the bridge closure, the road and sidewalk reconstruction will be completed. Based on weather, the final pavement layer will be placed either this fall or next spring.




Lake drawdowns are typically conducted each fall to reduce winter ice damage to shoreline properties and to reduce spring flooding. Drawdowns also give property owners an opportunity to conduct any necessary repairs to their waterfront property, provided they first secure a permit from the DES Wetlands Bureau at (603) 271-2147.

Drawdowns of Opechee and Winnisquam Lakes occur on a two-year interval; the drawdowns last occurred in 2020, so there will be no drawdowns of these lakes this year.

Lake Winnipesaukee is not included in the DES lake drawdown schedule. After Columbus Day, the releases from Lakeport Dam are reduced from a normal minimum of 250 cubic feet per second (cfs) to a flow between 30 and 50 cfs for a period of up to two weeks to allow for maintenance of the dams and hydropower facilities on the Winnipesaukee River. The flow of 30 to 50 cfs is the minimum flow needed to maintain the downstream aquatic life during this period. This year the reduction will begin on October 18.

FYI, by the middle of the fall, Lake Winnipesaukee is, on average, 15 inches below its springtime full level due to evaporation and releases from the lake that have occurred over the course of the summer. Because of this summer's drought, the level of the lake is already at that elevation. When the amount of water released from the dam is reduced after Columbus Day, the lake level is not expected to drop significantly for the remainder of the month of October and, if drought conditions ease in the fall and winter, it is expected to remain relatively stable through the month of December absent any major rainfall events. Depending on the amount of snow on the ground in the winter, the lake level may be lowered further beginning in January to a depth of two feet below the normal full level.

Lakes Region Planning Commission (LRPC) Transportation Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) Meeting Wednesday, October 6, 2021



Howard Johnson's at Weirs Beach was moved to this location in late November 1946 from its earlier McIntyre Circle location, where the restaurant had begun as a Dutchland Farms franchise in 1933, Avis Prout, proprietor. It became part of the Howard Johnson chain in 1937. Ho-Jo's at Weirs held its grand reopening, July 18, 1947. Entrance to Weirs Drive-In Theater would be built. in 1949, just off-photo at left. ... AND NOW

After 37 years under the orange roof at Weirs, Ho-Jo's was sold, in early April 1984, by Skip and Carol McLean, operators for 12 years, to Lou Gaynor and Harvey Chermin, who replaced the orange roof tiles and renamed the business as the 'Weirs Beach Family Restaurant and Gandy Dancer Saloon.' Six months later, Oct. 7, 1984, the building burned down and was not replaced. Up Endicott Street North (at right), the former Lobster Pound, which opened in 1980, became Faro Italian Grille in 2007.
