COURT ST

The planned closure to replace the Court Street Bridge begins on October 18, 2021.

Court Street will remain open during the closure up to the bridge which is between

Budget Gas and the Party Store. All businesses are open during this period and customers will be able to reach these business via their vehicles.

Through traffic will be routed onto the Laconia By-Pass. To support the increased traffic that will be using the off ramp that connects the By-Pass with Route 106, the contractor will install temporary traffic signals at that intersection. The temporary traffic signals will be installed on October 7, 2021 and will be in flash mode until October 18, 2021 when the traffic signals will be switched on to control traffic at the intersection. Message boards will be placed at several locations in Belmont and Laconia advising drivers of the change.

The closure is expected to take 32 days and the bridge will reopen on November 19, 2021. Once the closure is complete the contractor will be working on the road between Keasor Court and Addison Street. This area will remain open to two-way traffic after the bridge reopens and the street in the project area will be paved no later than the first week in December.

The Laconia Water Works and Busby Construction will be performing work on Court Street that will require shutting off the water on Sunday, October 10th, from approximately 7:30 pm until 4:00 am on Monday, October 11th. This will affect properties on Court St. and connecting roads from West St. to the Belmont town line.

This is necessary as part of the ongoing work on the Court Street Bridge. We will be notifying the properties affected, confirming when we will be working, and shutting off the water. Once the water service has been restored, simply run some cold water to clear any discoloration that may occur.

THEN ...

Former Gov. Francis P. Murphy of Nashua became owner, Oct. 7, 1946 — 75 years ago this week — of the Dr. A.J. LaFrance house at the corner of Church and Beacon streets, 'adjoining his large Laconia Tavern and Tavern garage holdings.' In this 1880s view, the Charles A. Busiel House is seen, at the corner of Beacon Street, with the Russell Carter House, just off-photo at left, behind the iron fence. After Busiel became governor of New Hampshire in 1895, his home was long known as 'the Governor's Mansion.' Tracks of the Laconia and Lake Village Street Railway run down Church Street and the North Church (Congregational) is seen at right after the tall steeple had been added in 1871. Close inspection discloses a horse-drawn streetcar in the distance. The Tavern Hotel would be built in 1912-1913, replacing the wooden buildings seen in distance at left. (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

The former 'Governor's Mansion' housed a number of professional and other offices over the years until being torn down in 1956 to create parking for The Tavern and Tavern Garage. From the early 1950s to late 1997, the LTC Amoco (later Exxon) filling station was in operation here, after which parking was restricted to Stafford House (Tavern) residents and patrons of the Senior Center, in the former Tavern Garage.
