- *News & Critic* Mar 1889 – Nov 1945
- *Laconia Citizen* Jan 1926 – Sept 2016
- *Laconia Daily Sun* June 2000 – present

Instructions for using the microfilm machine are provided, and Library staff is always happy to provide a quick tutorial. Articles can be emailed, or saved to a flash drive. Newspapers appear as they were originally published, and are not indexed. For this reason, please provide a date when submitting a request for an article or obituary.
