



SOLID WASTE

Trash Pickup Information



As part of the City's effort to improve the quality of life in the City, Public Works has been enforcing the City's [Solid Waste Ordinance](#).

Following are some of the issues that have resulted in violation notices and fines. The first violation results in a warning. The second violation results in a minimum of a \$250 fine.

Residents and businesses are putting solid waste containers at the curb too early and leaving them out too late.

Solid waste containers can only be placed out for collection after 7:00 pm the day before your scheduled collection day, and they must be removed from the curbside no later than 7:00 pm on your day of collection.

Bulky Items are put in the right of way too early for collection.

Bulky items are like solid waste containers. They can only be placed out for collection after 7:00 pm the day before your scheduled collection day and they must be removed from the curbside no later than 7:00 pm on your day of collection.

Bulky items do not have stickers on them.

The contractor will only collect bulky items if they have a City bulky item sticker on them. Many residents hope that someone will take the item for free leaving the item on the street too long, thus resulting in a violation notice.

Trash bags are on the ground.

The contractor will only collect trash if it is in a container. They will not collect loose bags that are on the ground.

Trash cans are overflowing.

The contractor has been instructed to follow what the City calls the "Iceberg Rule". If most of the bag is below the level of the rim of the trash container, the contractor will collect it. Otherwise, the bag will be left by the contractor and placed on the ground.

The contractor will only empty the number of trash cans allowed per home or business.

Single family homes are allowed two 32-gallon trash cans, duplexes are allowed four 32-gallon trash cans, triplexes are allowed six 32-gallon trash cans, and apartment and condominium complexes with over three units are allowed seven 32-gallon trash cans.

Yard waste (leaves and grass clippings) are put out too early.

The City only collects yard waste at the curb 4 weeks each year. Two weeks are in the spring and two are in the fall. Yard waste can only be placed curbside after 7:00 pm the day before your scheduled collection day. Laconia residents can bring yard waste to the Transfer Station; commercial establishments cannot. Please ensure your yard waste does not include any invasive species as the yard waste is composted and it can spread these species into other areas.



It is now open every Friday and Saturday from 10 am to 3 pm unless it is snowing. If there is a snowstorm, this facility will be closed as all Public Works personnel are involved with snow removal.

We accept clean wood only (not painted, stained or pressure treated). Wood and tree branches must be no longer than 3 feet with a diameter of 3 inches or less. Leaves are not accepted at the Brush Dump. Residents using this facility must have a Laconia dump sticker or a day pass.





About the Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction:



Winter is fast approaching and Public Works and NDOT are preparing the public streets and sidewalks for snow plowing.

One item that our residents can help with is moving their portable basketball hoops that are on or near the roads and sidewalks so they will not be hit by plow trucks and tractors. The hoops can damage the snow removal equipment, or the equipment can damage the hoops themselves.

No later than November 15th please move portable basketball hoops at least 5 feet back from the edge of roads or sidewalks as the weight of the snow coming off from the plows can knock portable basketball hoops over damaging them and anything that may be in their path.

Old Laconia City Hall (white building at right of center (seen from rear) stood approximately on the site of today's Bank of New Hampshire. This parking lot was located behind City Hall and other buildings on Pleasant Street (off-photo at right). Depot Square Auto Supply is seen in distance, just to left of City Hall, and a 1954-1955 addition to the Laconia Shoe Co. plant is seen in distance at far left. Congregational Church is glimpsed at extreme right. Water Street is behind the photographer. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Laconia Shoe addition was later home to a state Liquor Store before being torn down in 1982 for parking at extreme left. Meanwhile, Beacon Street West had been completed in November 1970 and the Laconia Savings Bank (now Bank of New Hampshire) replaced the Old City Hall in 1971, with the solar-powered drive-up facility built in 1981 and a two-story addition in 1986. 
