With the arrival of fall and winter not that far away, people will soon be needing to store their "toys" that require trailers. The City's Zoning Enforcement office would like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten from one season to the next.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which includes trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles](#).)

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards. There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be located.

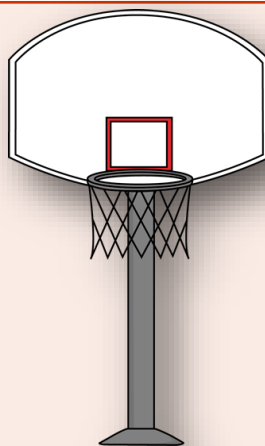
The City of Laconia Hilliard Rd.

10 am to 2 pm unless it is snowing. If there is a
snowstorm, this facility will be closed as all
Public Works personnel are involved with snow
removal and cleanup.

We accept clean wood only (not painted,
stained or pressure treated). Wood and tree
branches must be no longer than 3 feet with a
diameter of 3 inches or less. Leaves are not
accepted at the Brush Dump. Residents using
this facility must have a Laconia dump sticker
or a day pass.

Portable Basketball Hoops

Winter is fast approaching and
Public Works and NHDOT are
preparing the public streets and
sidewalks for snow plowing.

One item that our residents can
help with is moving their portable
basketball hoops that are on or
near the roads and sidewalks so
they will not be hit by plow trucks and tractors. The
hoops can damage the snow removal equipment, or
the equipment can damage the hoops themselves.

No later than November 15 please move portable
basketball hoops at least 5 feet back from the edge
of roads or sidewalks as the weight of the snow
coming off from the plows can knock portable
basketball hoops over damaging them and anything
that may be in their path.

CITY OF LACONIA CDBG, CDBG-CV PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Laconia City Council will hold 3 consecutive Public Hearings on November 22, 2021 during the regular City Council meeting which begins at 7:00pm at City Hall, 45 Beacon Street East, Laconia, New Hampshire 03246. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds are available to municipalities through the NH Community Development Finance Authority. Up to \$500,000 annually is available for Economic Development Projects, up to \$500,000 for Housing Projects, up to \$500,000 for Public Facility Projects, up to \$500,000 in Emergency Funds, up to \$25,000 per Planning Study grant, and up to \$1,000,000 available for each housing project under the CDBG-CV allocation due to COVID-19. All projects must directly benefit a majority of low- and moderate-income persons. The Public Hearings will comment on the following:

1. The Housing and Community Development Plan,
2. Progress of the CDBG-Covid project that provides funding to the municipality and service provider subapplicants for costs in preparing for, responding to, or recovering from Covid-19. Participating organizations include: The City of Laconia, Lakes Region Community Developers, Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Belknap House, Community Action Program and possibly Isaiah 61 Café.
3. Progress of the Laconia Housing Authority's balcony door replacement project at Sunrise Towers, 25 Union Ave. The project also includes renovations between Sunrise Towers and Sunrise House, 423 South Main Street, to improve accessibilities between the buildings and energy improvements. Energy improvements have been completed. The replacement balcony doors are under construction as well as the exterior work.

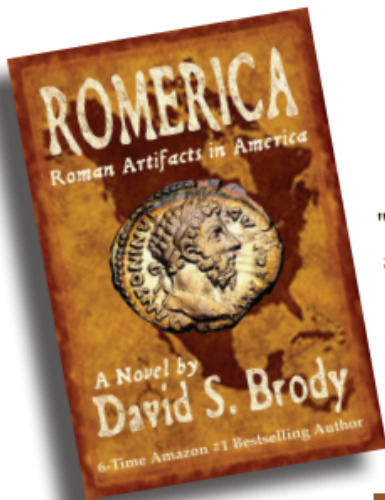

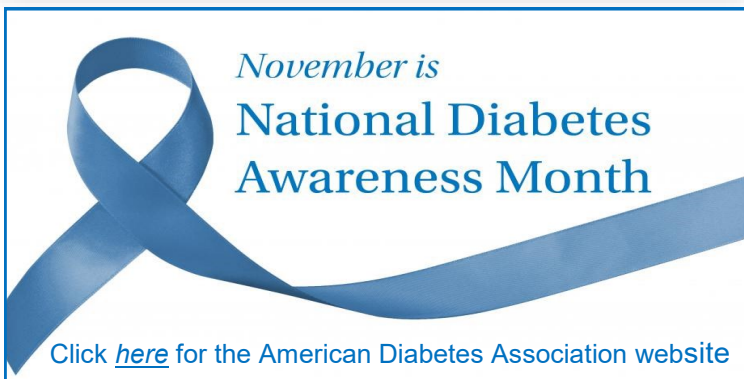

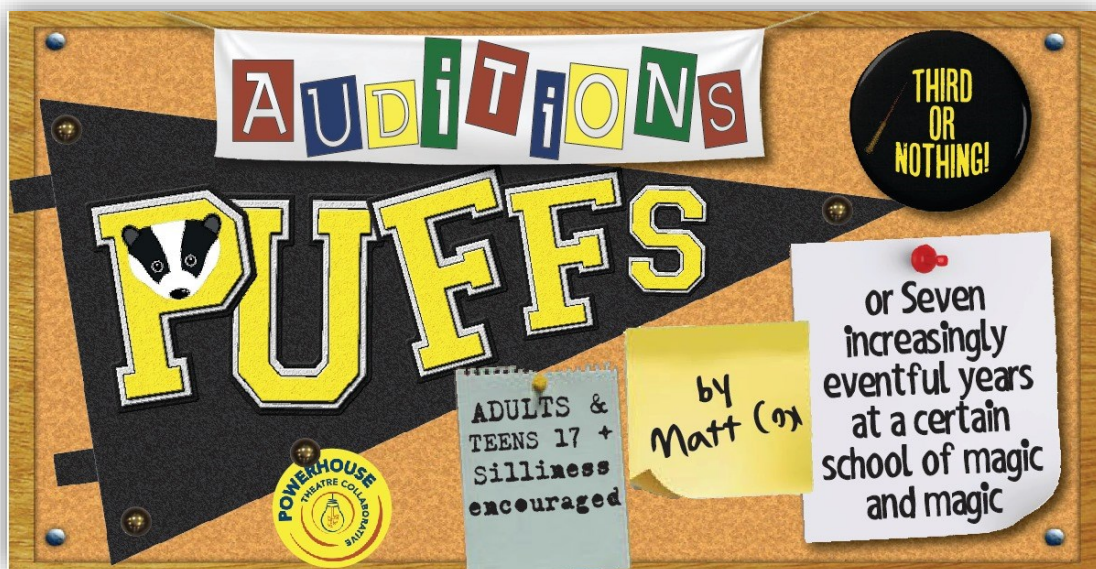

THEN . . .

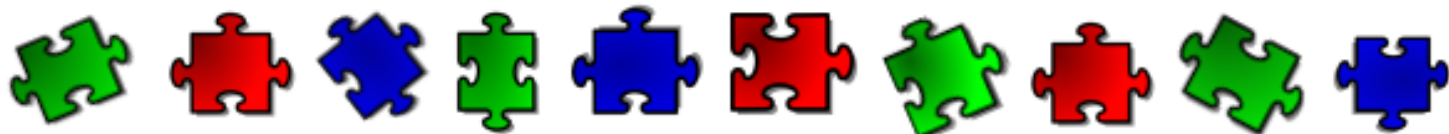
Wardwell Needle Co. factory at the corner of Mechanic and Manchester streets, Lakeport, seen circa 1899, had been established in the early 1860s in several locations near Elm Street. After Charles P.S. Wardwell died, in 1879, the company, under the management of John Aldrich, built this building, in 1884, on Mechanic Street. The product of the plant was 'the celebrated Excelsior needles for all kinds of hosiery machinery.' Later the Torrington (Conn.) Needle Co. operated a branch factory here and, still later, the tenant was a shoe company. (The Illustrated Laconian, 1899)



. . . AND NOW

Later, a machine shop operated in the building and Larry Brown operated Cove Craft wood products there before moving to Blaisdell Avenue in 1949. Fire, Jan. 16, 1961, destroyed the building, along with the city's Christmas decorations that had been stored on the top floor. Sanborn Park was dedicated, Nov. 11, 1973, on the site, to the memory of John L. Sanborn, the first soldier from Laconia to give his life, Sept. 5, 1950, in the Korean War.
