## Winter Curbside Collection Tips

### Laconia Residents!

Please help the City of Laconia keep the streets and sidewalks safe and passable during the winter!

The City normally does not cancel trash and recycling collection services unless the forecast is for blizzard conditions. If it does become necessary, the City will announce cancellation of those services due to weather.

During other winter storms when collections are not cancelled due to a storm, please do not place your trash or recycling containers on the sidewalk or at the curb. Your containers may be inadvertently damaged or knocked over by the plows or the snow coming off from the plows.

During storms Casella, the City's collection contractor, will empty containers that are left in areas behind sidewalks. Please consider putting them in your driveway. Questions? Please contact the Department of Public Works at (603) 528-6379. Thank you!





## Public Works Department

### Property Owner's Winter Survival Tips!

The best place to deposit snow when clearing your driveway is to put the snow downstream of your driveway. (Downstream is the direction the plow truck travels.)



When Public Works plows the street the snow will then be pushed away from the driveway instead of towards it.

Be nice to your neighbor and take them into consideration when you are clearing your driveway!

Also, you can minimize the amount of snow plowed into your driveway by creating a pocket in the snow just upstream of your driveway. This pocket will allow some of the snow on the plow to fall off into the pocket, resulting in less in your driveway!

City plow trucks have wing plows on them and, like delivery companies, we always want to turn right. This causes properties on an inside corner to have areas of deep snow. Corner lot owners should take this into consideration when developing methods to minimize the impact of snow coming off from a plow blade. Let us know if you have questions! Just call (603) 528-6379. ## Important Notice

At this time, the City's Transfer Station cannot accept refrigerators that use ammonia hydroxide gas instead of Freon as the refrigerant. The City is working on finding a contractor who is capable of recovering the ammonia hydroxide gas so that the refrigerator can be recycled. (See an example of an ammonia hydroxide gas refrigerator left)

These refrigerators typically run on propane and are often found in campers and other forms of recreational vehicles.

Businesses that maintain and repair campers may be able to recycle these refrigerators until such time that the City has found a contractor who can recover the ammonia hydroxide gas.







# Our yesterdays

*Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....*



## THEN ...

Main Street, Laconia, in the early 1890s is seen, looking south from old wooden building, at right, on site where Pemaco Block (Gardens Theater) was later built. White Noyes House, next right, was replaced by the Cook Block in 1896. And the Eagle Hotel Building is seen, beyond the Noyes House. On the left, the Dr. Harriman House is glimpsed behind an ornamental fence. The three-story Perley Block, at the corner of Hanover Street, included the Laconia Market of E.L. Dow. Looming over all is the Unitarian Church, built in 1868. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



## ... AND NOW

The Colonial Theater replaced the Dr. Harriman House in 1914 and the Perley Block was razed in 1950 to make way for the Landau store (later, Newberry's, Bloom's and now the Laconia Antique Center). The Unitarian Church burned in 1938 and was replaced by a First National grocery store, now Citizens Bank. On the right, the Cook block is followed by the building erected by the F.W. Woolworth Co. in 1937 on the site of the old Eagle Hotel, and still known to many as the Sundial Shop building. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)


