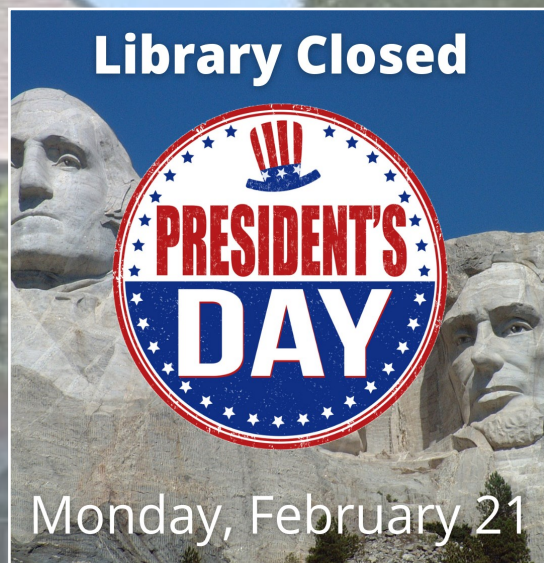

For the first time, the Belknap County Conservation District (BCCD) is offering its annual Tree, Shrub, Flower and Trout Sale Fundraiser both on-line and by mail. Visit the BCCD website to see the 2022 selection and purchase on-line. Offered are plants to grow your own fresh fruits and vegetables such as blueberry bushes, fruit trees, strawberry plants, raspberry canes, asparagus, onions, and many others that bear fruit enjoyed by wildlife and people alike. We didn't leave out those that prefer shade trees, Christmas evergreens, flowers, or plants that provide interesting landscaping. Most of the plants are sold 'bareroot' (no soil) and in a dormant state, and others will be in pots.

BCCD recommends customers place their orders by February 25th; however, orders will be accepted after the deadline while supplies last. The plants and trout will be ready for pick-up the last weekend in April. Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

Main Street, Laconia, from the Winnepesaukee River to Union Avenue before Urban Renewal in the late 1960s, gives an indication of the condition of several old buildings at that time. Businesses which had apparently vacated the Normandin Block, at left, were One Hour Martinizing in the former Paul's Restaurant, Shortle's Shoes and Mrs. Pappas' Shop. The Laconia Fruit Co., at the corner, right, was known as 'Baldi's Corner' for its one-time owner. After 1960, the city directories listed most of these store fronts as 'vacant.' (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

Initially planned as part of the site of a new First Methodist Church, this stretch of Main Street ultimately became Stewart Park instead. South Gate Condominiums and Sunrise Towers, in background, were both built during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s. Sunrise House, just off-photo at right, was built by Melcher & Prescott Insurance in 1968-1969 as one of the first new buildings in the Urban Renewal area. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)

Active Parenting of Teens
January 5-March 10, 2022. Class meets Wednesdays from 6:30-8:00pm (12 weeks)
Active Parenting of Teens will give parents the guidance and support needed to turn the challenges of raising a teenager into opportunities for growth. Topics include: influence of popular culture, skills for clear, honest communication, strategies to promote risky behavior, how to be an encouraging parent, and issues such as teenage dating, bullying and depression.
*There will be no class on March 2, 2022.

Parenting Skills
January 5-February 23, 2022. Class meets Wednesdays from 6:30-8:00pm (10 weeks)
This series is designed for parents with children who have special needs and health challenges, giving them an opportunity to explore their hopes and fears, develop effective parenting skills, enhance communication, develop strategies for facing challenges and recognize opportunities for celebration.

Developing Empathy & Self-Assertion in Supporting Skills Module*
January 11-February 15, 2022. Class meets Tuesdays from 6:30-8:00pm (10 weeks)
This module focuses on the importance of empathy & techniques for managing feelings such as anger and stress.

Communication Parenting & Discipline
January 11-February 15, 2022. Class meets Tuesdays from 6:30-8:00pm (10 weeks)
This program helps separated/divorced parents develop their children from parental conflict. Parents learn to guide their children through the process of recovery while establishing a cooperative long-term relationship with the other parent. This program educates parents on the impact their conflict has on their children, and teaches parents the practical skills they need to manage anger, increase impulse control, resolve conflict and talk to each other without arguing. While co-parents are welcome to take this class together, it is not required.

Strong Fathers Understanding Children's Growth & Development

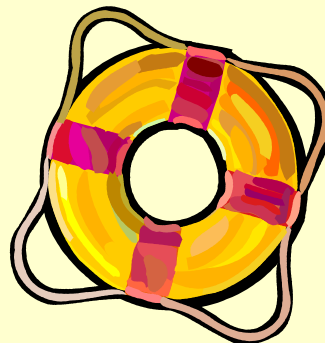


Now is a Good Time to Get Your Boat & Jet Ski Registration!

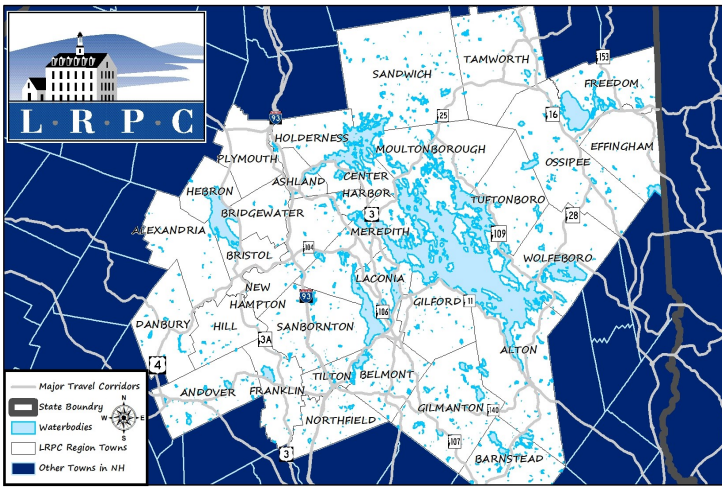

Regional Planners Launching Housing Review to Assess Needs, Find Solutions

The Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) project is launching a community survey, that encourages residents to share what impact the housing situation has had on them; what has worked, and what changes might be beneficial to communities and residents. The link to the Lakes Region's survey is available at <https://www.lakesrpc.org/serviceshousing.asp>.

At the conclusion of the project, the Regional Planning Commission will use this survey data, along with other qualitative and quantitative information from a variety of

sources to provide resources, strategies, and recommendations to local municipalities, to assist in their efforts to ensure housing availability.

Housing is an important issue; it helps determine the longevity and sustainability of the Lakes Region and its economic development. In New Hampshire and throughout the country, available housing is scarce, putting a strain on working families and making it difficult for some businesses to recruit and retain workers.

The trends and challenges affecting housing in New Hampshire and the Lakes Region are being studied as part of a project conducted by the Lakes Region Planning Commission (LRPC) in partnership with the state's eight other regional planning commissions, the New Hampshire Department of Business and Economic Affairs' Office of Planning and Development, and the New Hampshire Community Development Finance Authority. It is funded by an American Rescue Plan State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund grant.
