## Pothole Season is Here!



The City of Laconia, like most New England communities, is now experiencing one of the earliest and worst pothole seasons in years. Massive changes in temperature and large amounts of snowfall result in water seeping beneath the road then freezing and expanding.

This puts great stress on the roads and creates perfect pothole conditions.

Our Department of Public Works is out every day with a minimum of two crews (and sometimes a third crew) working to repair potholes on our streets and posting pothole signs to warn drivers. Please use caution and pay close attention to the condition of the streets. We appreciate your patience as we continue our efforts to make the streets safer and easier to travel. 

## CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective at 6:00 am on Monday, March 7, 2022, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited from using all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#).

Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

### Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.



### One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships

# Our yesterdays

## THEN . . .

**Elm Street Bridge, Lakeport, built in 1870 (but later replaced in 1914 by a concrete span), is seen from Franklin (later, McGrath) Square (off-photo at near left) in the late 1890s or early 1900s. Building at left was a grocery store. Across the bridge, at left, the Lake Company Building is seen, with the 1884 Brawn Block behind it. (The Lake Company controlled the Winnipesaukee River watershed, from 1831 through a later succession of owners, until the state took ownership of the Lakeport Dam in 1958.) In the distance, houses on Union Avenue are glimpsed. Building at right, on far side of bridge, was a tenement house. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)**



## . . . AND NOW

**A new bridge was built, to the right of the older ones, in 2003. The Brawn Block and buildings beyond it have been razed during the past year for new construction (seen here in yellow). In the distance, the Lakeport National Bank Building (now Fratello's) was built in 1917, replacing houses seen in the earlier view. To the right of the 1882 Opera House, the Lake Village Apartments, opened in 1983, are glimpsed. The former grocery store at left in the earlier view was torn down many years ago. ## Children's Auction Receives \$30,000 Award from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation

*Funds to be received over three years; in 2022, grant money will be spent on technology upgrades*



The Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction has received a \$30,000, three-year grant from the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation (NHCF). The funds—\$10,000 each year for three years—will help the organization upgrade its technology and increase its ability to raise more funds for kids in need.

"We are so thrilled," said Children's Auction Executive Director Jennifer Kelley, noting this year's allotment will be used for an IT upgrade. "The improvements will allow us to invest in technology and equipment that will deliver a better auction experience as well as allow us to create an online grant process that is more streamlined for our nonprofits."

Kelley added, "We are very grateful to the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation and its donors for its generosity and for selecting the Auction as a grant recipient. It's our mission to help further the work of area nonprofits that support children and families, and this gift will make it easier for us to raise funds while streamlining the grant application process for more than 70 nonprofits."

## Recycle Your Clothes at the Transfer Station!

Did you know that 85% of all clothing, shoes and textiles in New Hampshire goes to a landfill?

A clothes recycling container is now available at the Laconia Transfer Station in the area with the single stream recycling containers.

The organization accepting the material, Apparel Impact, works with clothing graders, and 85% of what they collect is reused. The other 15% of what they collect is in bad enough condition that it needs to be recycled for other purposes.

Apparel Impact also provides over 3,000 people in New Hampshire with free clothing through their community outreaches and partnerships with school districts and Easter Seals.

All items do not need to be clean, but they do need to be dry and free from mold.

# LED Lighting

**LED Lighting for private parking lots, private roads, and other outdoor applications**

In 2017 the City converted all of its streetlights on Eversource electric poles from high pressure sodium and metal halide to LEDs. The savings in electricity enabled the City to cut its electric bill for the City's streetlights in half.

In 2021 the Public Utilities Commission approved an Eversource outdoor LED lights rate for businesses and residences. LED lights cost less to operate than the high-pressure sodium and metal halide lights, which are still common in private parking lots and private developments in the City.

Condominium Associations, Homeowner's Associations with private roads and others should talk to their account manager at Eversource to determine if converting your outdoor lights to LEDs would be cost effective.
