The single most important thing you can do to prepare your children to read is to read to them every day. Research proves that children need to hear 1000 books before they begin to learn to read independently. Reading to children will increase their vocabulary and their listening and narrative skills. Reading with children will also help to instill in them self-awareness, confidence and an understanding of their place in the world.

HOW CAN I READ 1000 BOOKS?

It's easy!

One book a day for three years=1000

Three books a day for one year=1000

Ten books a week for two years=1000

Yes, you can repeat books! Read 1000 books, or read the same book 1000 times.

WHAT COUNTS?

Everything!

Every book you read counts every time you read it! Books your child hears in Storytime count. Books that others read to your child count. It all counts! If you are able to, make sure to keep a record of "any" book that is being read to your child. This includes teachers and siblings.

WHERE CAN I SIGN UP?

Sign up in the Children's Room and receive a packet of goodies to get started!

PRIZES!

Your child will earn a prize after completing their first 10 books, and then they'll earn a prize at every 100 books read. When they reach 1000 books, they'll earn an extra special prize!

WHEN

Register anytime when your child is between birth and five years old.

Thursday, April 14




