A clothes recycling container is now available at the Laconia Transfer Station in the area with the single stream recycling containers.

The organization accepting the material, Apparel Impact, works with clothing graders, and 85% of what they collect is reused. The other 15% of what they collect is in bad enough condition that it needs to be recycled for other purposes.

Apparel Impact also provides over 3,000 people in New Hampshire with free clothing through their community outreaches and partnerships with school districts and Easter Seals.

All items do not need to be clean, but they do need to be dry and free from mold.

Items that can be recycled include:

Purses/Bags  
Ties, Scarfs and Hats.  
Sneakers  
Any type of dress shoes  
Sandals

Flip Flops  
Clothing  
Coats/jackets  
Sheets & towels





## CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective at 6:00 am on Monday, March 7, 2022, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited from using all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#).

Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

### Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.



### One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships



## THEN ...

This was the South Main Street-Union Avenue corner, Laconia, in the early 1950s. 'Baldi's Corner' (Laconia Fruit Co.) is at left, beyond the Motorola TV sign, with the King (later Turcotte) Block, Palmer Plumbing Supply, Cormier Mill and Laconia Grist Mill beyond it on Union Avenue. Harold T. 'Pappy' Whittum's Mobil station occupies the corner, with Corriveau's Furniture seen behind it and, then, the steeple of First Methodist Church. Texaco Station of Dorval & Malone is off-photo at right. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



## ... AND NOW

Today's 'Sunrise House' (built for Melcher & Prescott Insurance during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s) is now associated with Sunrise Towers and together they extend as far as Baldwin Street. Stewart Park has replaced the buildings on Union Avenue and the church relocated to Gilford during Urban Renewal. Buildings at near left were replaced by today's Melcher & Prescott, located in the building erected during Urban Renewal as the Telephone Co. Business Office. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)



# **LED Lighting**

**LED Lighting for  
private parking lots,  
private roads, and  
other outdoor  
applications**

In 2017 the City converted all of its streetlights on Eversource electric poles from high pressure sodium and metal halide to LEDs. The savings in electricity enabled the City to cut its electric bill for the City's streetlights in half.

In 2021 the Public Utilities Commission approved an Eversource outdoor LED lights rate for businesses and residences. LED lights cost less to operate than the high-pressure sodium and metal halide lights, which are still common in private parking lots and private developments in the City.

Condominium Associations, Homeowner's Associations with private roads and others should talk to their account manager at Eversource to determine if converting your outdoor lights to LEDs would be cost effective.


