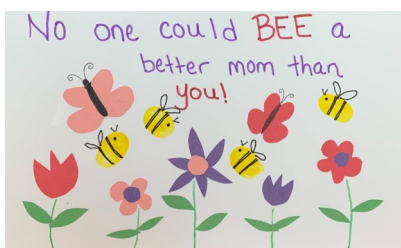

Laconia Public Library is thrilled to announce the addition of several play-based learning areas in the Children's Room, made possible by NH State Library ARPA grant funding. These fun spaces are designed to spark imagination and encourage child-directed exploration, all in an effort to increase school readiness. Newly acquired items include a play market and kitchen with accessories galore; a LEGO building station; a train table; a wooden shopping cart that makes book browsing extra fun; puzzles; discovery boxes for learning and sorting colors; wooden animals; magna-tiles; and, tons of blocks! Story Times have also seen

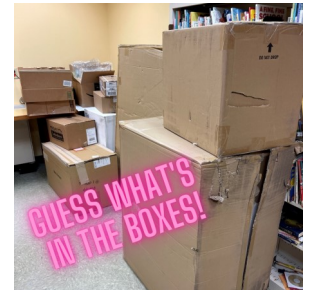
enhancements with the addition of individual seating, and an easel complete with felt board and magnetic letters.

Laconia Public Library Board Chairman, John Moriarty, notes, "Imagination and exploration have always been celebrated and supported in the Children's Room with its juvenile collections and literacy programming. The addition of quality educational toys provides even greater opportunity for young minds to learn and grow."

"New Hampshire's strong relationship with its public libraries was made even more evident during the past two years, when librarians and their staffs were able to adjust services nimbly in order to continue to meet the needs of their communities," said N.H. ## Growing a Pollinator Garden

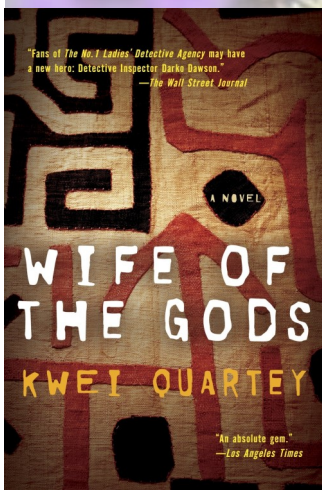

Join UNH Extension Master Gardener, Donna Miller, to learn how to grow your own pollinator garden. Insects such as bees and butterflies are helpful, and in some cases, essential, in pollinating many of our food crops such as apples, berries, and vegetables. In recent years, there has been a significant decline in the populations of these wild pollinators. Planting patches of flowers, wildflowers, grasses, shrubs, and flowering trees with an

emphasis on the use of native plants can encourage and support natural pollinators as well as enhance backyard landscapes. Recommendations for creating a pollinator habitat in your yard will be provided.

Donna is an Advanced Master Gardener, specializing in pollinators. She currently grows and sells cut flowers with her husband Jim at their Canterbury farm, Petals in the Pines. The farm is certified as a Monarch Way Station with Monarch Watch, and a Xerces Society certified pollinator habitat --and now they are "On the Map" with Homegrown National Park.

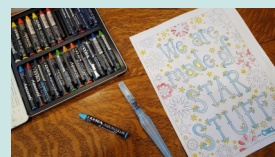

## LIBRARY PASSES

### Squam Lakes Natural Science Center

The Squam Lakes Natural Science Center is a combination of outdoor exhibits and self-guided tours which explore the nature of New Hampshire. The Center offers a variety of exhibits on many animals of the state. There are several acres of trails and gardens to explore as well as a picnic area, snack bar, and gift shop. Open meadows, mature forests, and marsh boardwalks connect interactive natural exhibits where native animals reside. Spend a day among black bears, mountain lions, river otters, bobcats, and more. Plan approximately two-and-a-half hours to walk the exhibit trail.



**Each pass allows up to four trail admissions for \$10 each every day from May 1 through November 1.**

### Castle in the Clouds

The Castle in the Clouds is a 1914 Arts and Crafts-style mansion with 16 rooms, many of which offer spectacular views of the lakes and mountains. See everything vintage from the clothes in Olive Plant's closets to the innovative electrical fixtures. Step out the back door to the lawn and stroll through the gardens - with breathtaking views of Lake Winnepesaukee and the Ossipee Mountains; you'll feel like you're on top of the world! Stroll through the magnificent gardens, or hike the 28 miles of trails and view the striking waterfalls.
