

CITY OF LACONIA CDBG PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Laconia City Council will hold 4 consecutive Public Hearings on July 11, 2022 during the regular City Council meeting which begins at 7:00pm at City Hall, 45 Beacon Street East, Laconia, New Hampshire 03246. Community Development Block Grants are available to municipalities through the NH Community Development Finance Authority. Up to \$500,000 annually is available for economic development projects, up to \$500,000 for public facility projects, up to \$500,000 for housing projects, and up to \$500,000 for emergency activities. Up to \$25,000 is available per planning study grant. Also, up to \$750,000 is available per public facility project under CDBG-Covid (CDBG-CV) funding. All projects must directly benefit a majority of low and moderate income persons.

Public hearings shall be held on the following items:

1. A proposed application to the NH Community Development Finance Authority for up to \$750,000 in CDBG-CV, or up to \$500,000 in CDBG Public Facilities funds, to support improvements, including window replacement and ventilation, at the Boys and Girls Club facility located at 876 N Main Street in Laconia. The majority of the participants at the Boys and Girls Club are of low and moderate income.
2. Adoption of the City's Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan concerning the proposed improvements at the Boys and Girls Club.
3. A proposed application to the Community Development Finance Authority for up to \$170,000 in CDBG Housing Grant Funds. Of the funds, \$20,000 will be retained by the City for administrative costs associated with the project, \$150,000 of the funds will be subgranted to Lakes Region Community Developers toward the acquisition of 11 Jameson Street. The unit will be rented as affordable housing to a tenant of low or moderate income.
4. Adoption of the City's Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan concerning the proposed Lakes Region Community Developers toward the acquisition of 11 Jameson Street.

Provisions for persons with special needs can be made by contacting the Meeting ADA Coordinator, at City Hall by calling 603-527-1265 at least 72 hours in advance of the public hearings so that the City can make any necessary arrangements.

LACONIA FIRE DEPARTMENT

NEW HAMPSHIRE

As we approach the 4th of July holiday, and the beginning of the summer season, it is time to pause to remember that safety has to be a priority when using consumer fireworks. Injury and unintended fires are a real possibility. It is everyone's responsibility to make sure these do not happen.

The National Fire Protection Association reported that more than 19,500 fires each year are started by fireworks. In 2020, 18 people died from fireworks related incidents. An estimated 15,600 people required emergency room

treatment, with the majority of these incidents occurring in the weeks surrounding the 4th of July. With these statistics in mind, it is important we remember some key points to keep everyone safe:

Only permissible fireworks are allowed in NH. Permissible means they have been made legal for sale, possession and use. These can be purchased in licensed NH retail stores. Other devices are illegal!

When using permissible fireworks, it is important to follow some very important rules to keep everyone safe.

- Display only on your own property
- Read all safety warnings
- Have a fire extinguisher and/or water hose nearby
- You must be 21 or older to buy or display permissible fireworks
- Always wear eye and hearing protection
- Light only one device at a time and move away quickly
- Keep all spectators a safe distance away
- Only display fireworks away from anything that can burn
- Discard used fireworks in a bucket of water; **do not throw away in regular garbage**
- Keep children away from where fireworks are being lit
- Do not allow young children to hold sparklers (see additional info regarding sparklers on [page 17](#))



Laconia Fire Department wants everyone to enjoy the July 4th holiday, and we also want everyone to be safe. The City of Laconia is looking for four members of the public to serve on the Capital Improvement Committee. This Committee meets three months of the year, September thru November. The Capital Improvement Committee is responsible for ranking and scoring forecasted capital improvements for the next six years.

City departments present recommended improvements to the Committee justifying why these projects are needed. The Board then scores and ranks each line item. Once the Board has ranked and scored all the submittals, they submit their recommendations to the Planning Board. The Planning Board then may provide

input and forwards the recommendation to the City Manager, who then also provides input and ultimately forwards them on to the City Council for possible adoption into the City Budget.

If you are interested in getting involved in City government and have an interest in what projects are being proposed in the City, this is a great committee to provide input on how you would like to see specific things funded.

2022 PARADE APPLICATION GUIDELINES

You are invited to participate in Laconia's 2022 Independence Day Parade on July 3rd.

GUIDELINES

Registration: Organizations are responsible for educating their participants of Parade rules and regulations. Entry contact person listed above must read, sign, and abide by the following, and is responsible for insuring the rest of the entry participants understand and abide by the information below.

Parade Route: The 1.5 mile parade route will leave from the Laconia High School parking lot and end at Opechee Park.

Acceptable Entries: Parade staff reserve the right to withdraw any parade entry that is offensive, illegal, or otherwise not reflective of Laconia and its purpose for the parade. Entries that are not consistent with promotion of the theme or spirit will be denied.

Float Dimensions: All vehicles or floats must be no wider than 10 feet; no longer than 60 feet; and no taller than ten feet. No projections off the body of the float (i.e. opened doors) will be permitted. Trailers and 18 wheelers are acceptable.

Display Requirements: All entries must display at least one sign or banner naming the business/organization.

Music/Sound: Any music played must be radio edited. This means that it cannot have inappropriate or foul language. Entries with obscene language or inappropriate implications will be removed from the parade.

Alcohol: Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on or in any entry vehicle. No consumption of alcoholic beverages by parade participants will be permitted before or during the parade.

Safety: All entries must travel the entire length of the parade. All motorized vehicles must be registered and inspected and have a certificate of insurance. Towed entries must have a rigid hitch and safety chains. Constructors deemed unsafe to participants or dangerous to bystanders will be denied. If you are providing objects to the crowd, they must be handed directly to them. Do not throw or toss objects during the parade. In addition, all candy must be individually wrapped, no chocolate. NO GLITTER!

Also, no pamphlets, fliers or any type of paper hand outs are allowed.

By submitting this application, the applicant agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Celebrate Laconia, its members, representatives and agents, from and against any and all liability, loss, cost, damage and expenses, including costs and attorney fees in defense thereof because of actions, claims, or lawsuits for damages resulting from personal or alleged to have been sustained by any person or persons and on account of damage to property, arising or alleged to have arisen directly or indirectly out of or in consequence of the applicant's participation in Laconia's 2022 Independence Day Parade on July 3rd





FIREWORKS are often used to mark special events and holidays. The only safe way to view fireworks is to attend a professional show. With many professional firework shows being canceled this year, it is important to know that **fireworks are not safe in the hands of consumers**. Fireworks cause thousands of injuries each year.

A few ideas to get into the patriotic spirit, without fireworks:

1. Use glow sticks, they glow in the dark and are a safe alternative to a sparkler. Fun for all ages.
2. Loud and proud. Noise makers are sure to make a statement. They can be found at local party supply stores or make your own.
3. Outdoor movie night. Set up a screen and projector. Don't forget the bugspray!
4. Red, white and blue silly string...fun for all ages.
5. Make a patriotic craft with the family.
6. Throw a birthday party for the USA, and don't forget the cake.



FACTS

- ! More than 19,500 reported fires are started by fireworks annually.
- ! Burns account for 44% of the 9,100 injuries treated in emergency rooms seen in the month around July 4.
- ! Half of the fireworks injuries seen at emergency rooms were extremities: hand, finger, or leg. One-third were to the eye or other parts of the head.
- ! Children ages 10–14 had the highest rate of fireworks injury, with more than one-third (36%) of the victims of fireworks injuries under age 15.
- ! Sparklers account for roughly one-quarter of emergency room fireworks injuries.
