


"Are We Smart Enough to Know How Smart Animals Are?"



Join us for a new Non-fiction Book Discussion Series for adults that will explore selected themes every four months. During the months of September through December, participants will be reading and discussing books about animal intelligence. The first book is "Are We Smart Enough to Know How Smart Animals Are?" by Frans de Waal.

Hailed as a classic, this book explores the oddities and complexities of animal cognition—in crows, dolphins, parrots, sheep, wasps, bats, chimpanzees, and bonobos—to reveal how smart animals really are, and how we've underestimated their abilities for too long. Did you know that octopuses use coconut shells as tools, that elephants classify humans by gender and language, and that there is a young male chimpanzee at Kyoto University whose flash memory puts that of humans to shame? Fascinating, entertaining, and deeply informed, de Waal's landmark work will convince you to rethink everything you thought you knew about animal—and human—intelligence.

The Non-Fiction Book Club will meet on the third Wednesday of the month, starting September 21, from 3:30 pm - 4:30 pm in the Rotary Hall Auditorium. 


