VOTER INFORMATION

For the Primary Election:

Voters who are Undeclared (aka Independent) may participate in this election. When checking in at the polling location, these voters can choose to take either a Democrat or Republican ballot. When exiting the polls, it is advised to check with the election workers before leaving the polls to change back to Undeclared if you want to avoid having your party affiliation changed to Democrat or Republican. Any voters who are already declared as a Democrat or Republican will automatically be provided with that party's ballot when checking in at their polling place.

Playwriting Workshop for new and experienced Playwrights!

This fall Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative will again be offering its popular 10 week playwriting workshop for veteran as well as inexperienced playwrights looking for a chance to improve their writing skills.

In ten weeks instructor Bryan Halperin will shepherd you through the process of writing a short play ready to be performed. The workshop is open to teens 16+ and adults. Space is limited and will be allocated on a first come, first serve basis.

Says Halperin, "In 2020 when we were looking for things we could do over Zoom we discovered that Zoom offered a perfect medium for this workshop. People could participate without having to make a drive to a central location, and Zoom was just as effective for reading plays out loud and sharing feedback. It allowed us to create some plays specifically for Zoom which allowed participants from all over to be involved in a Powerhouse production." As a result, the 2022 workshop will also be held over Zoom and participants will be invited to write a play either for Zoom or to be performed outside in a park. These plays will then be produced in the 2023 Powerhouse season.

Fee for the workshop is \$150 and the workshop will be held on Thursday nights beginning September 8th and ending on December 1 (no classes 10/13, 10/20 or 11/24). There is homework between classes, as that is when most of the writing takes place. Class sessions are geared toward readings, feedback, and exercises.

Like anything, the more you invest in the process, the more you will get out of it.

Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction's First Theater Fundraiser Raises Over \$10,000

The Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction's first-ever Broadway Fundraiser held at the Colonial Theatre Laconia last week entertained hundreds and raised just over \$10,000 for local children and families in need. Roughly 400 tickets were sold, and nearly 150 children attended the show at no cost, thanks to generous donors who sponsored seats through local nonprofits.

Organizations that had children attend included Belknap House, Boys and Girls Club of Central NH, Central NH Foster & Adoptive Parent Support Group, Got Lunch! Ashland, Got Lunch! Campton/Thornton, Hands Across the Table, Mayhew Program, and Tapply-Thompson Community Center.

The show offered Broadway-themed musical performances by local community theater groups, including Franklin Footlight Theatre, One Light Theatre, Powerhouse



Theatre Collaborative and The Streetcar Company, as well as an array of dancers from Broadway North. The event was sponsored by Bank of New Hampshire and MB Tractor & Equipment, along with media sponsors Laconia Daily Sun and Lakes 101.5 FM. Perfect Lines donated bags of popcorn for the kids in the sponsored seats.

The evening's performance was produced and directed by Jessica Alward and her creative team, including Scott Alward, Hillary Ayers, Sarah Olsen and Kelli Powers. The goals of the Broadway Fundraiser were to raise money for the nonprofits that support local children and their families in need; to highlight the extraordinary talent in this community; and to create an event to expose to the arts children who might not otherwise have this opportunity.
