VOTER INFORMATION

For the Primary Election:

Voters who are Undeclared (aka Independent) may participate in this election. When checking in at the polling location, these voters can choose to take either a Democrat or Republican ballot. When exiting the polls, it is advised to check with the election workers before leaving the polls to change back to Undeclared if you want to avoid having your party affiliation changed to Democrat or Republican. Any voters who are already declared as a Democrat or Republican will automatically be provided with that party's ballot when checking in at their polling place.

THEN ...

Messer Street Bridge, Laconia, is seen around 1950, with the gas works across the Winnipesaukee River at right; Lake Opechee and Opechee Street are at left. Built in 1923, the bridge had its first major repair in 1957 when the old concrete deck was removed, the stringers scraped and repainted and a new concrete deck put in place. First bridge at this location had been a wooden covered bridge. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The gas house blew up, March 4, 1952, ending production of gas that had begun on the site in 1894. The site is now occupied by a display lot and flagpole of Irwin Motors (obscured by foliage at right). The current Messer Street Bridge was officially opened to traffic, May 29, 1980, after more than a year of construction during which traffic bound for Lakeport and Weirs Beach had to be routed over Church Street and Union Avenue or via North Main Street and Parade Road. In both views, the home of Harrison Messer, 19th century resident for whom the street was named, is just off-photo at left. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)


