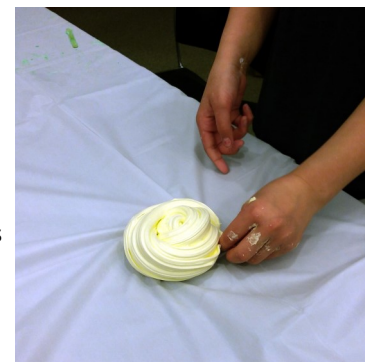

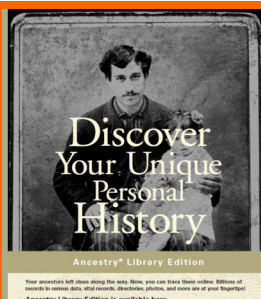

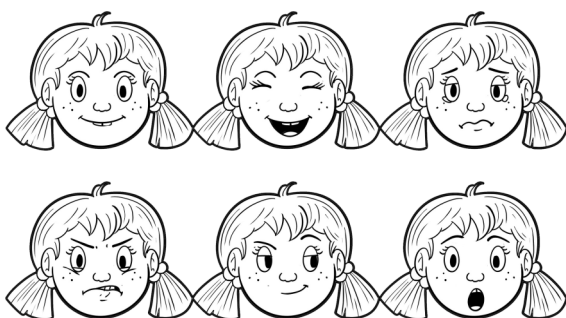

Wild History: 350 Years of New Hampshire Wildlife

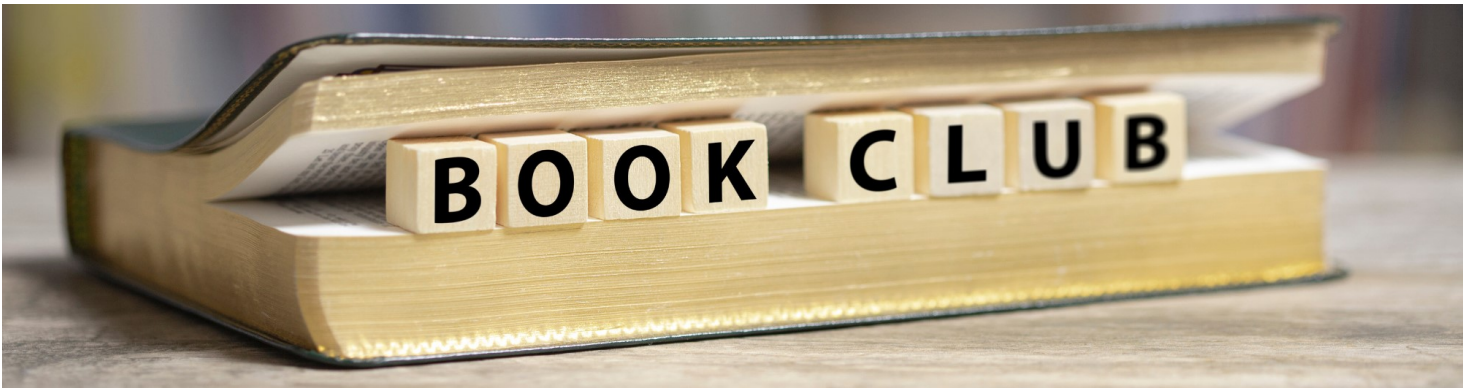

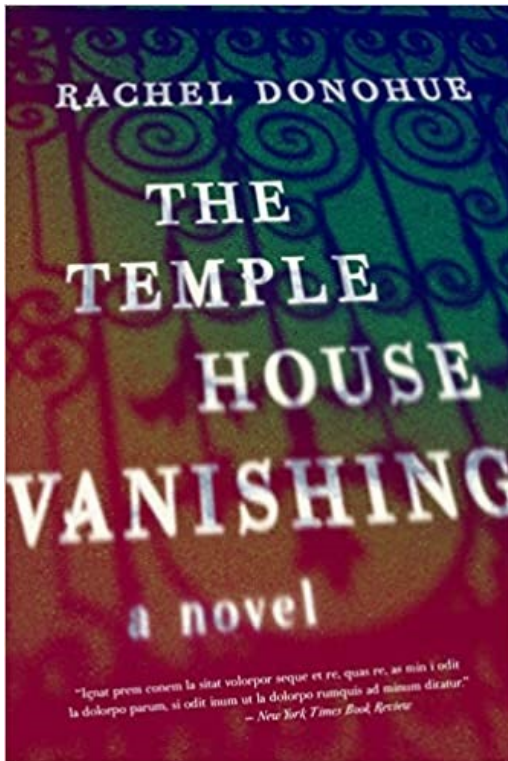

“Fuzz: When Nature Breaks the Law”

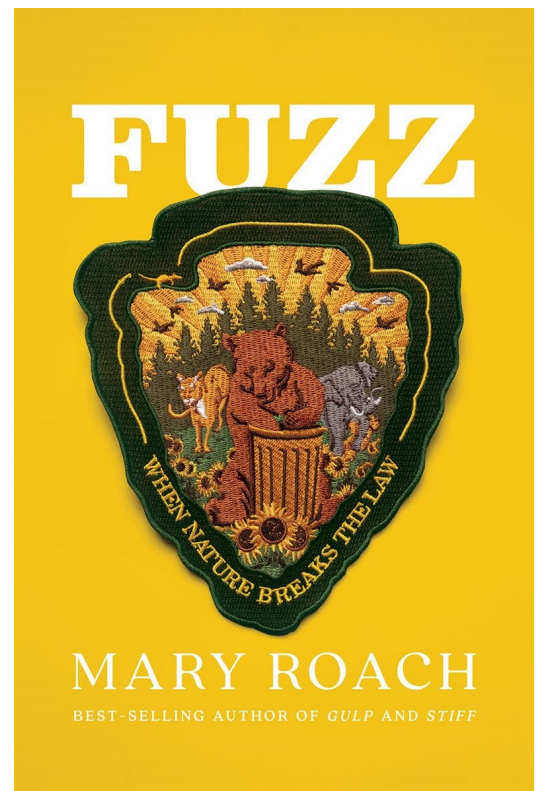

Check Out our Telescope

Laconia Public Library is excited to announce that it is now lending a telescope donated by the New Hampshire Astronomical Society.

The New Hampshire Astronomical Society has been placing telescopes in libraries since 2008. Inspiration for this program was taken from an excerpt from Robert Frost's poem, *The Star-Splitter* (the poem can be read in full here: <https://bit.ly/3OU5DO1>),

*The best thing that we're put here for's to see;
The strongest thing that's given us to see with's
a telescope. Someone in every town
seems to me owes it to the town to keep one.
In Littleton it may as well be me.*

The Orion StarBlast 4.5" telescope provides clear, high-powered viewing of the night sky and includes instruction manuals and a National Audubon Society Constellation pocket guide. Library patrons can check out the telescope for 1-week intervals starting Monday, August 22.
