




Our Storytimes have new names! Toddler Time (Wednesdays) is a fun-filled hour with Jamie and is geared toward newborns and toddlers to age 3.





Non-Fiction Book Club:



THEN ...

This is the Union Avenue-South Main Street corner, in Laconia, as it looked in the mid- to late-1950s. The Motorola TV sign was located on the building at 426 South Main, earlier home to Cantin Chevrolet until 1947. Beyond the sign, the Laconia Fruit Co. — popularly known as 'Baldi's Corner' — is glimpsed, along with other buildings on Union Avenue. At right in the distance at top is the steeple of the First Methodist Church, at the corner of Baldwin Street. And occupying the corner lot is the filling station of Harold T. 'Pappy' Whittum. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

During the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s and early 1970s, Sunrise Towers (glimpsed in upper right corner) replaced the church and several other structures and Melcher & Prescott Insurance built a new office building, facing South Main Street, now called Sunrise House (far right), and now part of the Sunrise Towers complex. In 2010, Melcher & Prescott relocated across the street (far left), to the former Telephone Co. business office, adjacent to the former Cantin Chevrolet location. 'Baldi's Corner' and the other Union Avenue buildings (in distance, center) are now part of Stewart Park. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)



Soft Plastics Collection

On Saturday, September 24th, from 11 am to 1 pm, the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club and the Green Sanctuary Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia are holding another collection.

Soft clean plastics are accepted. Blue and white Amazon bags are acceptable. No crunchy snack bags, no pet food bags, no boat storage covers. Any attached paper on bags needs to be cut off.
