With the arrival of fall and winter not that far away, people will soon be needing to store their "toys" that require trailers. The City's Zoning Enforcement office would like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten from one season to the next.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which includes trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.](#))

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards. There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be located.

Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative begins rehearsals for A Christmas Carol

Fifty-nine community members ranging in age from 7-70+ have begun rehearsals for the 2022 presentation of Joel Mercier's *A Christmas Carol: The Musical Ghost Story*. Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative, the theatre program at the Belknap Mill and resident theatre company of the Colonial Theatre, has once again partnered with NCCA at Jean's Playhouse in Lincoln to bring this holiday favorite to the Colonial Theatre stage for four performances December 16-18.

The final entry in this year's Colonial Series, sponsored by RE/MAX Bayside and Bank of New Hampshire, brings together 26 members of last year's cast (some in different roles) and 33 newcomers to the production.



Powerhouse producer Bryan Halperin says, "Last year we had 39 cast members and felt the show was a big success in challenging our participants and entertaining the audience. We are thrilled that this year we found a way to include even more members of our theatre community." The big change from last year is the addition of a choir of carolers who will entertain audiences pre-show with a presentation of traditional Christmas carols for those who come early, and then join the cast from the theatre boxes to add their voices to the group numbers in the musical. Says Halperin, "We also hope that our carolers will do some community outreach and spread some holiday cheer at other locations."

Also new this year is three-time NH Theatre Award winner Ray Dudley taking on the role of Ebeneezer Scrooge. Ray has been seen on professional and community stages throughout New Hampshire but makes his home in the Lakes Region. Ray appeared as Jacob Marley in an early production of this show, and this will be his debut on the Colonial stage. Ray is excited for the challenge, one of which is facing the inevitable comparisons to other famous Scrooge portrayals, and says, "Actors such as Albert Finney, Patrick Stewart, Michael Caine and even Mr. Magoo have done the part!! Another challenge is his transformation. His ultimate redemption has to be believable. From despicable, condescending and cruel to a humble, generous and warm human being."

Last year's performances were nearly sold out! Tickets are already on sale for this year and all the details can be found at powerhousenh.org or coloniallaconia.com.

Prices are \$18 for students, \$20 for seniors and \$22 for adults.

Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

The Hotel Picard and the smaller building, to the left, were located approximately where the Real Life Church is today, on Pleasant Street, Laconia. Before it became the Hotel Picard, the hostelry was known as the Kirtland House — which closed abruptly, 125 years ago this week. (See 'Our yesterdays' for 1897.) The structure had originally been part of the O'Shea Bros. Department Store in Bank Square but had been moved to this location to make way for the Moulton Opera House in 1886-1887. Persons of a certain age may recall its 'almost twin' on Bank Square, occupied by the Laconia Hardware Co. until Urban Renewal. (Photo from The Illustrated Laconian, 1899)



... AND NOW

The brick structure now occupied by the Real Life Church was built in 1929 and first occupied as the Crosby Buick Garage. It became an A&P grocery store in May 1937 which closed, Aug. 16, 1969. The Laconia Hardware Co. then relocated there from Bank Square, when its location on Bank Square was razed during Urban Renewal, until Aug. 31, 1998. The next occupant was a Goodwill store, which opened March 6, 2000, and moved to Belmont in March 2016. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)
