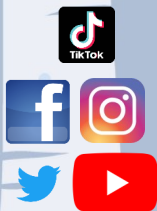

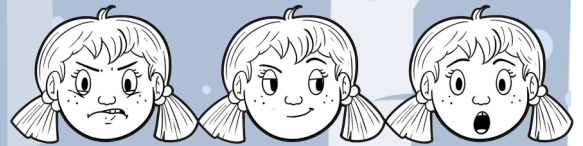

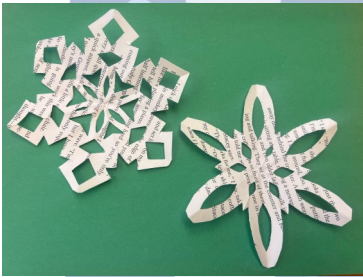

Step 2: fold on diagonal into a triangle

Step 3: fold in half to make a smaller triangle

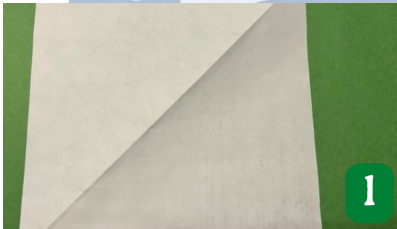
Step 4: fold into thirds

Step 5: you now have this shape

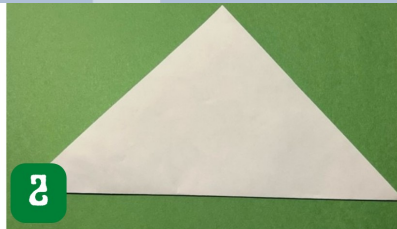
Step 6: cut off points

Step 7: draw design, making sure to keep some folded edges

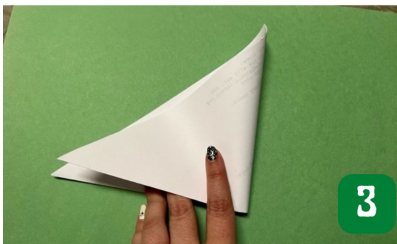
Step 8: cut and unfold to see your snowflake!



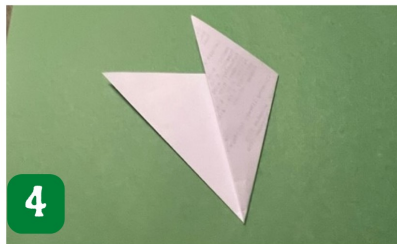
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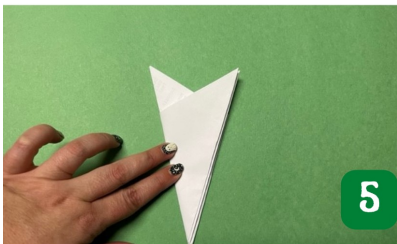
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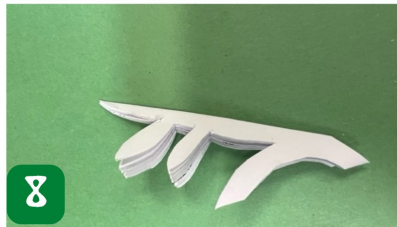

Professor E. John B. Allen will present *New Hampshire on Skis*. Take Scandinavian and Austrian immigrants, the Dartmouth Outing Club, the Cannon Mountain Tramway, the muscular Christian, amateur tinkers, and Professor E. John B. Allen. Cover it with snow and shake, and you have all the makings of a unique New Hampshire history.

Professor Emeritus of History at Plymouth State University, John Allen was awarded the International Skiing History Association's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2009. He serves as historian for the New England Ski Museum in Franconia, as a consultant to several ski history documentaries, and is the author of several books.

Cinnamon Moon Milk

3 tsp Honey
1/4 tsp Cardamom
1 tsp Cinnamon, ground
