TRANSFER STATION AND BRUSH DUMP WEATHER RELATED CLOSINGS!

Downtown property owners, businesses and managers...

The current snowstorm is going to be a long but moderate event (if the predictions are right). The National Weather Service has the storm ending about 1 pm on Saturday. PROPERTY TAX BILLS WERE MAILED 11/28/22!



Tax bills were mailed on November 28, 2022 and are due December 28, 2022. The 2022 tax rate was set at \$14.85 per thousand; this is a decrease of \$4.01 from the 2021 rate of \$18.86 per thousand.

Your July 2022 tax bills reflect half of the 2021 tax rate of \$9.43. Tax bills are calculated as follows: The July installment is $\frac{1}{2}$ of the previous year's rate total, multiplied by your previous year's assessed value. The December installment is the new rate (which is determined by the NH Department of Revenue), multiplied by your updated assessed value to get your total tax for the year. We then minus out the July installment and you pay the difference. The Assessing Office has until the December billing to finalize your assessments for the tax year.

Questions about your assessed value should be directed to the Assessing Office at 603-527-1268. Questions about payments should be directed to the Tax Office at 603-527-1269.

Payment options are: In-person, the drop box on the side of City Hall, through the mail at PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247, over the phone at 1-855-906-0411 or online at www.laconianh.gov

Please note there is a fee of 2.79 % for all credit/ debit card transactions and a \$0.95 fee for all ACH transactions online.

Art Exhibit at the Belknap Mill in Celebration of Martin Luther King Jr. in January 2023

Calling All Artists:

Every year the Laconia Human Relations Committee (LHRC) holds a celebration of Dr. King on the day before his annual birthday celebration. His life is a rich tapestry that still overlays our society including non-violent protests and eloquent speeches ("I have a dream", etc.). His was an iconic life of struggle with desegregation, unionization, housing, antiwar and poverty in America.

This year the Human Relations Committee, with the help of the Belknap Mill and Elaine Morrison, are planning a special celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. which will be expressed through display of art. There will be a month-long exhibit in the Mill's Riverside Gallery. In addition, there will be an afternoon on Sunday, January 15th when selected artists will have an opportunity to talk about their pieces.

- Theme: The life and/or work of Martin Luther King Jr.
- Originality: Your submission must be your original work. The work must be inspiration of the life and/or work of Dr. King.
- Required: Artist statement about how their piece reflects some aspect of the life and work of Martin Luther King, Jr. A framed work is preferable, but if the cost of preparation to make it suitable for framing is an issue, we will find a way to help you defray the cost.
- A statement of intent and short artist bio must be received, including medium proposed as well as overall size. Each proposal will be reviewed and acted upon as soon as they are received, so don't wait.
- Inclusion of the work is not guaranteed and is at the sole discretion of the exhibitors.
- If you receive the go-ahead based on your statement of intent, your work must be received by Dec. 26th .
- The show will run from January 2nd through January 30th in the Riverside Room.
- The Art Exhibit is open to artists of all ages from the Lakes Region and students in Laconia School District.








The City of Laconia will have a low-barrier cold weather shelter to offer safety to those who are experiencing homelessness. The initiative is a result of public concern about the growing homelessness issue, and the work of Laconia's Homelessness Task Force led by Mayor Andrew Hosmer, and recent community-wide discussions led by Laconia Police Detective Eric Adams and Navigating Recovery's Daisy Pierce.

The shelter will be open during significant or extreme weather conditions and will have capacity to house up to 30 people between the hours of 7pm to 8am, from December 1st, 2022 through April 1st, 2023.

This effort is possible through funding from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) Homeless Assistance and Prevention, and the collaborative efforts of several community nonprofit partners: City officials, the Laconia Police Department, Navigating Recovery, the Partnership for Public Health, and Isaiah's Café. Lakes Region Mental Health Center (LRMHC) will manage staffing and

operations of the shelter, because of their successful history managing one of the state's two COVID shelters for the homeless during the pandemic. LRMHC has hired a shelter manager and will begin recruiting shelter workers to staff the facility. LMRHC has enjoyed a lengthy partnership with DHHS with contracts for services since its incorporation in 1966.



The City asks that all residents be good neighbors and not park or block sidewalks with their cars and trucks. Blocking sidewalks with vehicles prevents the City from plowing and sanding the sidewalks which causes pedestrians to walk in the streets.

We also ask that snow plow contractors and residents not plow or blow their snow across the street. This is a hazard to drivers that could result in a driver losing control and crashing.

Please be sure to give the City's plow trucks plenty of space as they are plowing the roads. Getting too close behind them may cause salt crystals to spray against your vehicle.

Union Avenue, Laconia, is seen around 1900, from the Main Street intersection, with 'Baldi's Corner' glimpsed at extreme left, the Woodbury Melcher House at right and the First Methodist Church in distance at left, at corner of Baldwin Street. The long set of buildings seen at center was the Dr. Wells/Snierson House — later occupied by the Corriveau Furniture Co. Main Street runs left to right behind the photographer. Today the space is dominated by Sunrise Towers. The former Melcher & Prescott Insurance Building, erected during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s, is just off-photo at right, now converted to Sunrise House, an assisted living facility. Other structures in this space from the 1930s-1960s included the Mobil station of Harold T. 'Pappy' Whittum and Earl's Diner, later operated by The Dearborns. Prevention Is Better Than Reaction



Temperatures have been moderately warm for this time of the year but do not let this warm spell fool you and make you believe that pipes are not capable of freezing.

Temperatures are falling below freezing at nights which would allow for the pipes to freeze. As always be cautious and double check that all the pipes are properly protected.

If the temperature inside a house gets below 32 degree Fahrenheit (0 degree Celsius) it's likely that the water supply pipes and the drain traps will freeze. When water freezes it expands 9 percent, and if there is no room for expansion it's possible that the pipe will develop a crack and eventually leak once the ice thaws out. Fixing a ruptured pipe can be expensive, but the damage from uncontrolled water leakage can easily reach into the thousands of dollars.



The majority of the calls received for frozen water pipes and water meters are a result of inadequate heating and cold air drafts where piping is located in the home. It is recommended that property owners check their property for these conditions and identify the location of their water meter and shutoff valve before an emergency.

The property owner is ultimately responsible for repairs to the piping within the home or building. The Water Department can replace frozen or damaged meters.

Customers will be charged for the cost of the replacement of the meter and service calls, as applicable. Your plumber can also replace a frozen meter.

If for any reason you cannot stop the flow of water from a frozen or broken pipe, call the Water Department's 24-hour emergency number at 603-524-0907.
