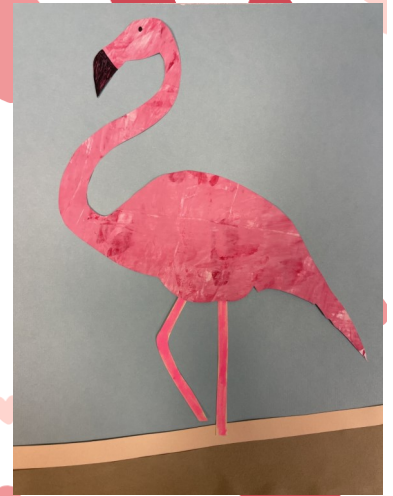

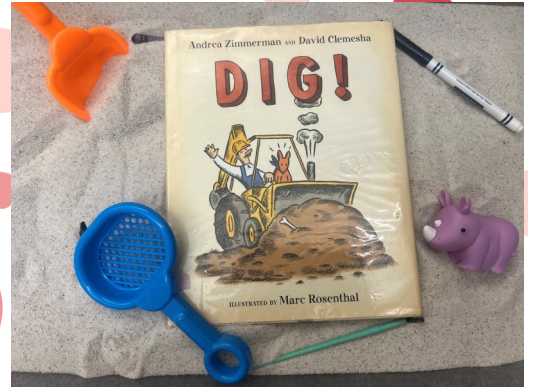

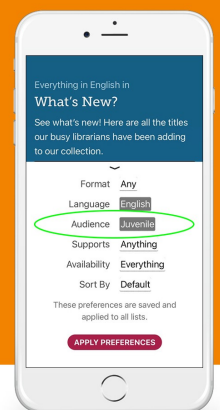

Evening Nonfiction Book Group: "This Land of Snow" by Anders Morley

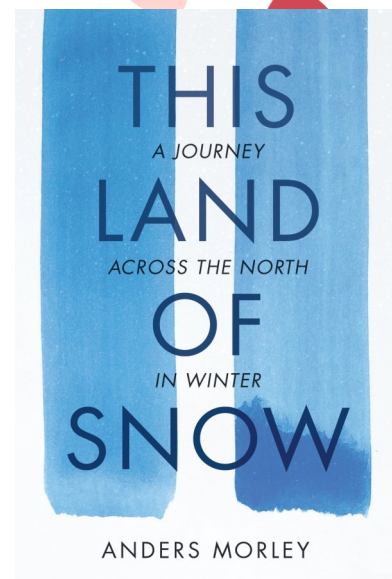

Local Author Talk: "This Land of Snow" by Anders Morley

Come along on an adventure into the depths of a northern winter with Anders Morley, winner of the 2021 National Outdoor Book Award for travel writing, as he presents *This Land of Snow* in the Auditorium. *This Land of Snow* is the story of his four-month journey through the wilds of northwestern Canada on cross-country skis. More than just a tale of adventure, *This Land of Snow* is a meditation on the coldest season and on the approach of mid-life, which Booklist's Brenda Barrera has called "a captivating memoir" and "an eloquent ode to the harsh beauty of winter." Morley will discuss and share anecdotes from his journey, read from his book, and show photographs from along the way.



Anders Morley grew up in New Hampshire and began skiing at age five. He contributes regularly to New Hampshire magazine and his work has appeared in a variety of other publications including The Globe and Mail, Northern Woodlands magazine, Maisonneuve magazine, and The Aurean. Morley lives in northern New Hampshire.

ILL & Tech Help

How to check out books for your book club

Have you been thinking about starting a book club? The library can help!

If you are not sure what book you would like to read, try a Reads-To-Go kit! A Reads-To-Go kit includes fifteen paperback copies of a book along with discussion questions to ask during your book club. You can reserve kits ahead of time to make certain they will be available for your group. To browse titles on Reads-To-Go, type www.eventkeeper.com/kitkeeper/index.cfm?curOrg=NHHLA into your internet browser. Once you have selected a title, call us to request the kit for you.

If none of the titles on the Reads-To-Go list strike your fancy, the library may be able to inter-library loan copies of your selected title. Whatever you choose, please make sure that the title has been out for at least six months. They likely will not come in all at once, it's possible that the library may not be able to get enough copies, and due dates will vary. The patron requesting will also be financially responsible for the copies in the event of loss or damage.

If you would like to see how many libraries in the state have a copy of your selected title, you can search the state catalog at www.nhais.shareit.com to make an informed decision about whether to ILL your chosen title.
