

WINTER IS FUN AT BOLDUC PARK!

Looking for a budget friendly way to have fun and fresh air this winter? At Bolduc Park year round disc golf and cross country skiing are available to the general public for a modest donation and free to lower income youth and one supervising adult.

Concern over climate change and its effects is currently widespread and increasingly a consensus position. In contrast to the development of consensus around what is happening and the challenges this poses, there is a broad diversity of opinion around what are the best climate solutions, i.e. what should be done?

The EN-ROADS Climate Policy Simulator is an easy-to-use, publicly accessible online tool which helps to clarify the relative merits and effectiveness of a range of policy solutions for addressing climate change.

Peter Dugas, EN-ROADS Ambassador and Citizens' Climate Lobby Maine State Coordinator, will lead a discussion and demonstration of the EN-ROADS simulator, which will explore the climate impacts and relative effectiveness of policies including: investments in solar and nuclear power; large-scale tree planting; market-based price incentives for emissions reductions.

Peter Dugas is the Maine State Coordinator for Citizens Climate Lobby, a nonpartisan grassroots organization focused on effective and equitable climate solutions. He serves as the liaison to the office of Senator Angus King (ME-I) and is an EN-ROADS Climate Ambassador. Peter has been an active advocate for robust climate policy since earning a degree in Physics and Engineering from Brown University and lives and works in Portland, Maine.

THEN ...

This snow fort in Veterans Square was a feature of one of the Winter Carnivals held here, a century ago during the 1920s. Steeple, including the town clock, of the Christian (later Evangelical Baptist) Church — now 'The CAKE' — in background, was toppled during the Hurricane of 1938. (Laconia Public Library)



...AND NOW

Snow removal is now more extensive than in the 1920s. The Evangelical Baptist Church relocated to Lakeport in 2014 and the Veterans Square edifice was occupied by 'The Holy Grail' restaurant from 2015-2017. The 'Chaos and Kindness Experience' opened in October 2021. The Congregational Church (UCC), at right, was dedicated in June 1906, on the site of the Harriet Gale House, which was moved east to become the Parsonage, later Parish House (obscured by the snow fort in the earlier view). 
We are trying to build up funds for a new kitchen, so we will be conducting fundraising events and would love to hear your ideas and support with volunteering as well as donations.

THE VIETNAM WAR

A LACONIA HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY PROJECT



Throughout the month of April, students in Taylor Osborne's CCR US History class at Laconia High School will be engaging in several different historical processes as they create a project focusing on Laconia's involvement in the Vietnam War. Students will work with the Laconia Historical and Museum Society to analyze primary sources from the 1960s and '70s, as well as connect with local Vietnam veterans to hear and share their stories. Students will generate biographies of several of Laconia's veterans. Their research and work will culminate in the creation and public presentation of a website towards the end of May.

Community Support Is Needed:

Members of the Laconia Historical and Museum Society have worked to connect with veterans who would like to take part in interviews. Additionally, the Historical Society is able to provide several years' worth of newspapers and members of the Historical Society are available to work with the students as they investigate these documents. The class is hoping to gather resources from friends or family members of Laconia's Vietnam veterans, to share the stories of those who are no longer around to share them themselves. Examples of helpful primary sources could be things like photographs, letters, journals, etc (*Students will work with copies of documents, and all original copies will be returned, unaltered, to the rightful owners*)
