


### Think Twice Before Buying Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute? However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia.

Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts.

In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City [website](#) or call the Planning office at (603) 524-1264 to find out.

A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!



# Our yesterdays

## THEN ...

For well more than a century, flumes like the one visible at lower right carried water from the Avery Dam to the turbines which powered the mills on both sides of the Winnipesaukee River. The wooden Mill Street Bridge was closed to all but foot traffic in 1949, and to all traffic, including pedestrians, in May 1956. Ell of the Busiel Mill, seen up river in distance at right, was demolished in February 1971. (Laconia Public Works Department photo, 1954)



## ...AND NOW

The flume on the south bank of the Winnipesaukee River was still in use for some years after World War II by the Guild-Northland Mills, which were experiencing a shortage of waterpower in 1948. (See 'Our Yesterdays' for 75 Years Ago.) The flume was removed in September 1972. The wooden Mill Street Bridge was replaced, in September-November 1958, by the current steel footbridge, which opened, Nov. 13, 1958. The 1972 City Hall is visible, right of center, beyond the Busiel Mill. The hydro-electric plant at extreme right went on line in 1986. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)

# IRS Certified Volunteers Providing FREE TAX PREPARATION

IRS VITA/TCE return preparation sites are operated by certified volunteers. Site operating hours and services offered may be limited. ## LACONIA HISTORICAL & MUSEUM SOCIETY

The Laconia Historical & Museum Society has undertaken an important project focusing on Laconia's Veteran history.

This project is separate and different from the project LHMS is supporting at Laconia High School.

LHMS is seeking any information and/or photos of the structures and members of the various Veterans organizations in the City of Laconia, including Lakeport and the Weirs. These organizations include; the American Legion Post 1, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1670, the John Perley G.A.R Post in Laconia and the Darius A. Drake D.A.R Post in Lakeport and The New Hampshire Veterans Association.

We are also interested in any information from the Army and Navy Club, which was located in the Laconia Gas and Electric Block during the early 1900's, The Mary Butler Chapter of the D.A.R. and the Woman's Relief Corps.

Any original material, such as photos or handwritten documents will be digitally archived into the LHMS permanent collection under the individual or family name and the original items will be returned. However, LHMS will accept donations of original items into the permanent collection should an individual or family choose to do so. This information is being collected for an informative presentation to be held in May 2023.

As well, an exhibit focusing on the personal stories of Laconia's veterans will be created for display in November. LHMS is collecting photographs and written information on veterans themselves – these could be newspaper articles or notices, handwritten letters, journal or diary entries or family memories.

There is no limit to when or how long the veteran served or whether the veteran is alive or deceased. The information can be shared with LHMS by friends, family members, or fellow service men or women.

As this is an exhibit of Laconia veterans, we do ask that the veteran has lived in Laconia at some point in their lives or lives in the City currently.

## Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction Awards \$525,000 to 60 Nonprofits

The Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction (GLRCA) last week distributed \$525,000 in grants to 60 area nonprofit organizations at a luncheon event at the Huot Career and Technical Center that also included a workshop on digital marketing. Corina Locke, the creative director of SnapRoot Creative Digital Marketing, an agency that collaborates with the Auction, offered the talk on how nonprofits can use an online software graphics program called Canva to enhance the posting they are doing on social platforms like Facebook.

"We were glad to see everyone enjoying their meal and feeling grateful not only for their grant but for the chance to network with other nonprofit leaders and to learn from Corina," said Jaimie Sousa, chair of the Auction board. "It was a great opportunity to get everyone together."

Grants will be used by the local nonprofit organizations to fund wide-ranging programs that support local children and families in need. These programs address needs that are vital to the well-being of children in our communities, including food and housing insecurity and related emergency assistance; afterschool programs, recreation, education and the arts; childcare and related family resources; and healthcare, including victim outreach and support and preventative health and wellness training.

# News from the Public Works Dept.

## CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE: SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective at 6:00 am on Monday, March 13, 2023, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited from using all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#).

Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

### Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.

### One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships




