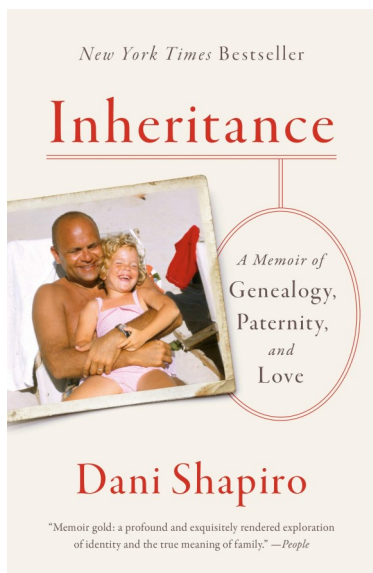
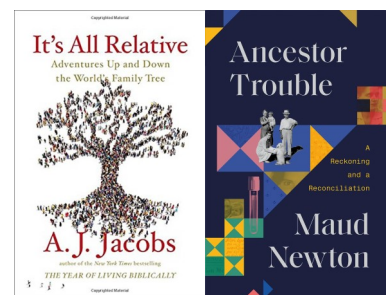
Genre-fication of the Teen Room!

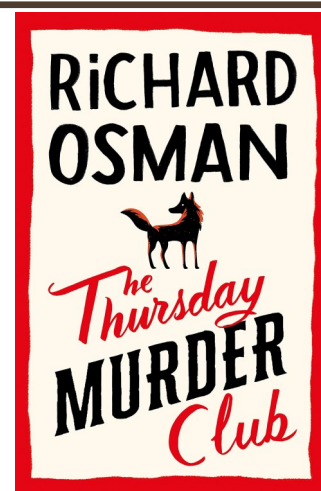

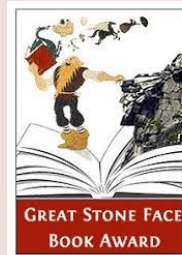

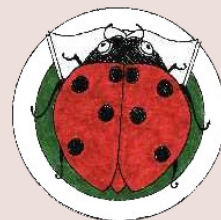
