

Double Your Distance!

New Hampshire Marine Patrol and Lake Winnipesaukee Association are in agreement that we need to "double the distance!". The safe passage law remains the same, restricting boaters to headway speed within 150 feet of any other boat, shore, docks, or mooring fields, but Capt. Brendan Davey with the Department of Safety said current conditions warrant doubling that distance. Staying 300 feet from the shore and maintaining headway speed will help reduce your impact on the shoreline.

Pollution and sediment are added to the lake at an alarming rate in rain events like these because the ground only has the capacity to absorb so much. Because of the high water level, with the added height and additional wave power, waves are crashing onto the shoreline and affecting areas that normally would not be impacted. Storm runoff contains bacteria, pollutants, and excess nutrients that are washed into the lake. Reducing your wake and doubling your distance will help reduce your impact on Lake Winnipesaukee.






Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

The watering trough in Lakeport Square, 'which has quenched the thirst of many a horse during the past forty years or more and which in recent years has been an easy target for amateur auto drivers,' was 'now out of existence,' 100 years ago, today. 'With a pick and shovel ceremony,' July 29, 1923, 'a crew of men from the street department made the removal.' Passenger Station and Freight Depot were built in 1900. House at corner of Clinton Street (at right) was torn down in 1917 to make way for the Lakeport National Bank Building, so the postcard shows the square sometime in the very early years of the 20th century. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Passenger Station was removed in July 1986, but the Freight Station is still there, behind the foliage. White building with gazebo, center left, was erected in 1985-1986 by Lakeport Landing Marina but is now part of Irwin Marine. (Lakeport Landing structure, built in 2018-2019, is off-photo at left.) The Union Avenue Baptist Church, whose spire is visible at right in the earlier view, was torn down in 1940. Case N' Keg occupies the site today. Fratello's opened in the former bank building in August 1992. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)


