





The Nonfiction Book Group will be creepin' it real in October as they read “The Five: The Untold Lives of the Women Killed by Jack the Ripper” by Hallie Rubenhold. Polly, Annie, Elizabeth, Catherine, and Mary-Jane are famous for the same thing, though they never met. For more than a century, newspapers have been keen to tell us that “the Ripper” preyed on prostitutes. Not only is this untrue, as historian Hallie Rubenhold has discovered, it has prevented the real stories of these fascinating women from being told. Now, in this devastating narrative of five lives, Rubenhold finally sets the record straight, revealing a world not just of Dickens and Queen Victoria, but of poverty, homelessness and rampant misogyny. They died because they were in the wrong place at the wrong time--but their greatest misfortune was to be born a woman.

Mystery Book Club: “Daisy Darker” by Alice Feeney



Join us for Fantastic Fiction, a new book group run by several Laconia Library staff members. Fantastic Fiction will explore different genres in fiction and meet monthly to discuss the book they read. This month the group will read and discuss “On Earth We’re Briefly Gorgeous” by Ocean Vuong.

“On Earth We’re Briefly Gorgeous” is a letter from a son to a mother who cannot read. Written when the speaker, Little Dog, is in his late twenties, the letter unearths a family’s history that began before he was born — a history whose epicenter is rooted in Vietnam — and serves as a doorway into parts of his life his mother has never known, all of it leading to an unforgettable revelation. At once a witness to the fraught yet undeniable love between a single mother and her son, it is also a brutally honest exploration of race, class, and masculinity. Asking questions central to our American moment, immersed as we are in addiction, violence, and trauma, but undergirded by compassion and tenderness, On Earth We’re Briefly Gorgeous is as much about the power of telling one’s own story as it is about the obliterating silence of not being heard.



Attendees are encouraged to bring a notebook and pen, and a favorite tarot deck (it's okay if you don't have one). This program isn't about "fortune-telling," psychic predictions, or pinning down "what the cards mean." This program will not include personalized readings or card interpretations from Kate, instead, it is about empowering you to explore new avenues of self-reflection!

Kate Sheridan, a.k.a. The Laundress, is a tarot reader and astrologer who believes that fortunes are created rather than told. Her approach is therapeutic rather than predictive, and her work is deeply informed by Jungian psychology.

NEA Big Read Book Discussion: “The Bear” by Andrew Krivak



Book Discussion with Alex Prud'homme, Author of "Dinner With The President"

Join the Laconia Public Library, the Putnam Fund, and the Laconia Daily Sun at the Lakeport Opera House for a Book discussion with Alex Prud'homme, author of "Dinner with the President." The discussion includes a lecture with a PowerPoint presentation and Q&A session, followed by a cocktail reception/discussion in the bar area with a cash bar and dessert. Alex is a freelance writer whose work has appeared in The New York Times, The New Yorker, and other publications. He is the co-author of Julia Child's memoir, "My Life in France", and has authored or co-authored "The French Chef in America", "France is a Feast", "Born Hungry", "The Ripple Effect", "Hydrofracking", "The Cell Game", and "Forewarned". He lives with his family in Brooklyn, New York. "Dinner with the President" is described as a wonderfully entertaining, often surprising history of presidential taste, from the grim meals eaten by Washington and his starving troops at Valley Forge to Trump's fast-food burgers and Biden's ice cream—what they ate, why they ate it, and what it tells us about the state of the nation.
