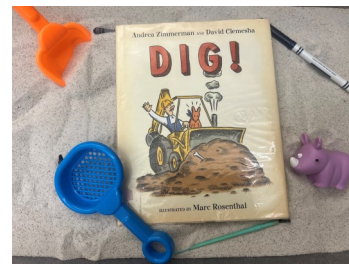

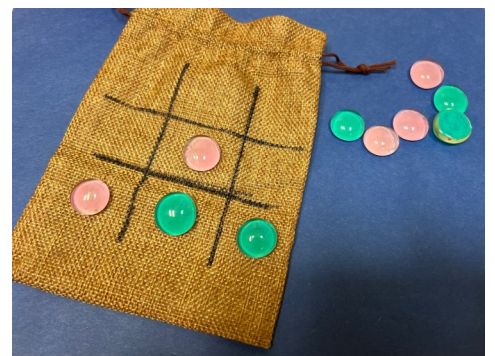

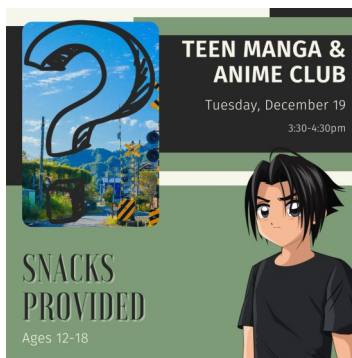

Did you get a new device?

At drop-in tech help, we can help patrons with

- The basics of how to navigate their laptop, smartphone, and tablets/e-readers
- How to use social media
- How to set up an email account
- How to use Microsoft Office
- How to use our Library apps, Hoopla, and Libby, to download ebooks and audiobooks, and more to their device
- How to use Google and their various services
- Any other questions or inquiries deemed appropriate

We can NOT help patrons with

- Filing taxes online
- Online banking
- Online shopping
- Fixing their device if it is physically broken
- Any other questions or inquiries deemed inappropriate

In order to be prepared for drop-in tech help, patrons should come prepared with

- Their device
- A list of questions or concerns that they have
- Paper and pen or pencil to take notes
- Any usernames and passwords needed to get into online accounts

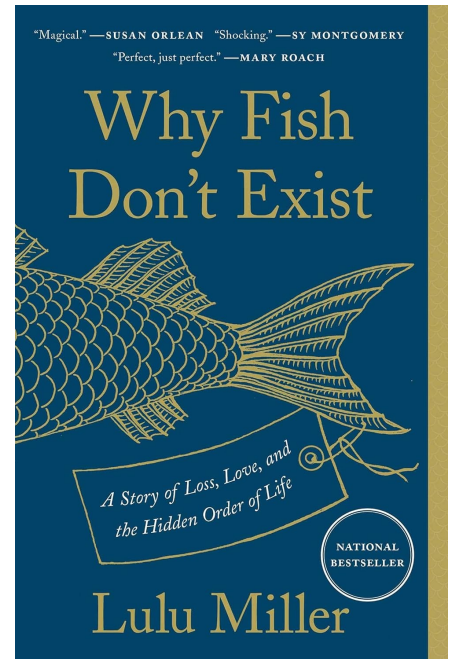

David Starr Jordan was a taxonomist, a man possessed with bringing order to the natural world. In time, he would be credited with discovering nearly a fifth of the fish known to humans in his day. But the more he uncovered, the harder the universe seemed to try to thwart him. His specimen collections were demolished by lightning, by fire, and eventually by the 1906 San Francisco earthquake. Many might have given up. But Jordan? He surveyed the wreckage, found the first fish that he recognized, and confidently began to rebuild his collection. And this time, he introduced one clever innovation that he believed would at last protect his work against the chaos of the world. When NPR reporter Lulu Miller first heard this anecdote in passing, she took Jordan for a fool; a cautionary tale in hubris, or denial. As her own life slowly unraveled, she began to wonder about him. What she would unearth would transform her understanding of history, morality, and the world beneath her feet.

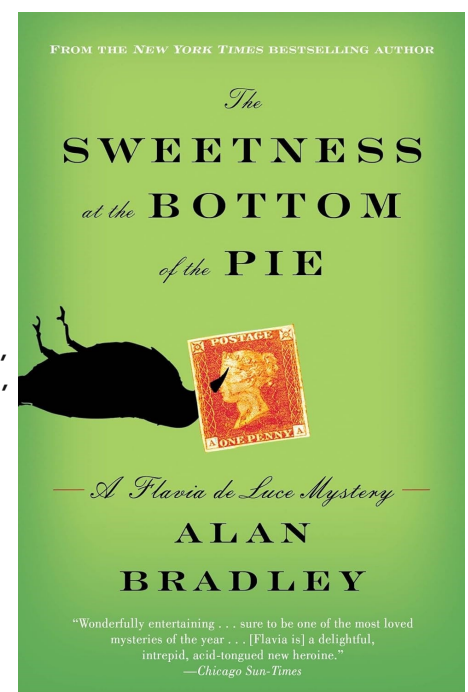

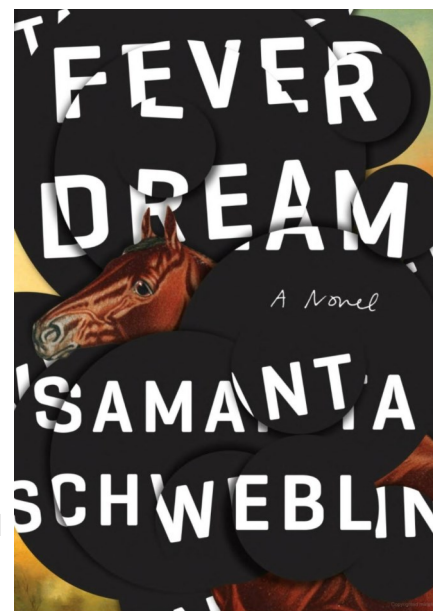

Fever Dream is a nightmare that comes to life, a ghost story for the real world, a love story, and a cautionary tale. One of the freshest new voices to come out of the Spanish language and translated into English for the first time, Samanta Schweblin creates an aura of strange psychological menace and otherworldly reality in this absorbing, unsettling, taut novel.

How to check out books for your book club

Have you been thinking about starting a book club? The library can help!

If you are not sure what book you would like to read, try a Reads-To-Go kit! A Reads-To-Go kit includes fifteen paperback copies of a book along with discussion questions to ask during your book club. You can reserve kits ahead of time to make certain they will be available for your group. To browse titles on Reads-To-Go, type www.eventkeeper.com/kitkeeper/index.cfm?curOrg=NHLA into your internet browser. Once you have selected a title, call us to request the kit for you.

If none of the titles on the Reads-To-Go list strike your fancy, the library may be able inter-library loan copies of your selected title. Whatever you choose, please make sure that the title has been out for at least six months. They likely will not come in all at once, it's possible that the library may not be able to get enough copies, and due dates will vary. The patron requesting will also be financially responsible for the copies in the event of loss or damage.

If you would like to see how many libraries in the state have a copy of your selected title, you can search the state catalog at www.nhais.shareit.com to make an informed decision about whether to ILL your chosen title.

The Orion StarBlast 4.5" telescope provides clear, high-powered viewing of the night sky and includes instruction manuals and a National Audubon Society Constellation pocket guide. Library patrons can check out the telescope for 2-week intervals.

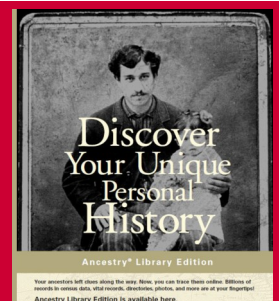
