Happy Holidays at Laconia Public Library

The Laconia Public Library is excited to host an afternoon of music with the Canterbury Singers on Saturday, December 2 at 1:00 pm in the library's auditorium. The Canterbury Singers partner with the Canterbury Shaker Village to present authentic Shaker music, expanded by American folk songs, music of early America, and inspired arrangements by a variety of composers. The Canterbury Singers are one of the very few non-auditioned, high quality professionally directed choral experiences for mixed voices in the Capital area. No sign up is required.

Laconia Library will host an exhibit of fiber art created by Carol Dale, from December 1st through the end of February. Carol is a fiber artist with a vast collection of stitched fabrics, quilts, and hand dyed threads. One of her quilts was the New Hampshire selection for a Smithsonian exhibit in Washington, D.C.. This exhibit will feature a variety of items representing the different

mediums and styles Carol has worked in. This display will be located in the Library Rotunda.

The Library offers three monthly book groups. On Thursday, December 14 at 6:00 pm the Library will host an informational session presented by 603 Legal Aid's Tax Clinic about the Low-Income Tax Payer Project. This program will share information about how 603 Legal Aid can help low-income tax payers resolve problems including: deficiency notices, liens or levies, audits, applying for Innocent Spouse Relief or Injured Spouse Relief, Earned Income Tax Credits, qualifying for the Dependency Exemption, or issues around worker classification. 603 Legal Aid is here to bring you relief! This is a free informational session, so, please, bring a friend! No sign-up is required.

The Writing Group will gather on Wednesday, December 6 at 6:00 pm in the library's auditorium. The group meets monthly and utilizes writing prompts, discussion, and other fun activities to keep your writing practice fresh. New participants and all levels of experience are welcome! No sign-up is required. Do you quilt, knit, embroider, crochet, or felt? Join us for Stitch Craft, an informal fiber arts group that meets biweekly on Thursday, December 14 and 28 at 10:00 am.
