

The goal is to have read 1,000 books before your precious one starts kindergarten. If you read just 1 book a night, you will have read about 365 books in a year. That is 730 books in two years and 1,095 books in three years. Feel free to keep a record of any book that is being read to your child including by teachers and siblings.



It also helps us to treat ourselves and one another with greater kindness, gentleness, and care. During our time together, we will explore through discussion and practice:

- What is Mindfulness
- Mindfulness of Breath
- Mindfulness of Body
- Mindfulness of Thoughts and Emotions
- Mindfulness and Self-Compassion

Articles can be emailed, or saved to a flash drive. Newspapers appear as they were originally published, and are not indexed.
