The Church Street bridge repair project starts March 11th.

The Church Street bridge was built in 1980 and is over 43 years old. The bridge needs some work to recondition it for the next 20 years of its life.

The project will repair the bridge's expansion joint that is on its east side and the area where the sidewalk and road surface meets. The work includes:

- Replacement of the expansion joint. Over the years the joint has corroded, and it is no longer capable of retaining the gasket that prevents stormwater and salt from getting onto the metal bearings. These bearings allow the bridge to expand and contract.
- Removal of the granite curb on the downstream side of the bridge and repairs to the sidewalk. The joint between the granite curb and the deck allows saltwater to get into the deck, corroding the steel, and weakening the concrete. The contractor will remove 3 feet of sidewalk measured from the curb for the full length of the bridge. This is to enable the contractor to repair the deck and the sidewalk.

On Monday March 11th the contractor will block the parking spaces on the downstream side of the bridge to remove the curbing and to remove the sidewalk. Both travels lanes will be open this week.

On March 18th, the contractor will block the downstream side of the bridge to begin the process of removing and repairing the deck and the joint. Traffic will be two way alternating and the contractor will be using the temporary traffic signals with the countdown timers similar to the ones used on the Messer Street bridge last year. The sidewalk on the upstream side of the bridge will remain open during the work.




Plastics Recycling and Community Action Program Food Drive Saturday, March 16th



Annual Robbie Mills Memorial Tournament

Aug. 2, 1998: Robert J. "Robbie" Mills, 14, died, the victim of murder in connection with the theft of his bicycle. Hundreds of mourners attended calling hours for the youth, Aug. 7, as an "angry and bewildered community" searched for closure. Mills had been a student at Memorial Middle School "where he was going to enter the eighth grade in September. He was active in sports and loved NASCAR racing and the outdoors. He had been employed at Bonanza Steak House and had purchased his bicycle with his own money.

In Robbie's memory we work together to provide funding for the Boys & Girls Club and the Children's Auction. We also support the Robbie Mills Sports Complex so that the youth have a place for sports as well as an opportunity for after school programs. These are things that Robbie felt we should have. By making these things a reality it brings something positive out of a tragedy.

The Concord-Laconia Connector connects the Lakes Region to southern NH CAT Launches New Commuter Bus Route – the Concord-Laconia Connector

Have you heard? Concord Area Transit started running the Concord-Laconia Connector intercity commuter bus route last month. This service is offered fare-free connecting Concord to Franklin, Tilton, and Laconia.

The Concord-Laconia Connector (CLC) has 15 bus stops along the route, including major employment, medical and retail destinations such as Merchant's Way, Merrimack County Complex (Nursing Home and County Corrections), Franklin Industrial Park, J. 


