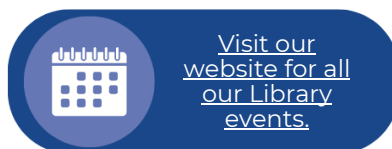

Dear Members of the Laconia School Community:

The Laconia School District is moving to an online registration system that will go live on April 1. The goal of this process is to make registration more accessible for families. For families with incoming elementary students, the goal is also to balance class sizes across the three (3) elementary schools. Here is some information about this registration process in the District schools:

### The Online Registration Process


- Registration for all schools will move to an **online platform called Alma Start**, which can be accessed at <http://sau30.almastart.com> beginning on Monday, April 1.
- AlmaStart will be the platform for the online registration, which synchronizes with the District's Student Information System (SIS).
- **The registration process is for new students**, including PreK and Kindergarten students for 2024-25.
- There will be **support for families** to complete the online registration at the SAU. Parents and guardians of middle and high school children can also go to LMS and LHS for assistance in the registration process.
- **Information about the online registration process and attendance zones as well as the links for the registration** will be posted on the District web site. This information has been pushed out to *The Laconia Sun*, local daycare providers, ParentSquare, the Laconia Public Library, Laconia Links, and on school and district social media pages.

### 2024-25 PreK, Kindergarten, and other new elementary students

- **The goals for an online, central registration process** are for students to attend the school in their attendance zone, to keep families together, to maintain class sizes that are as small as possible, and to balance class sizes across the district.
- Elementary students are initially placed in the school zone of their residence when they register on AlmaStart. In our central registration process, a child's placement will be finalized by the SAU.
- **The SAU will confirm each child's school in writing in approximately two (2) weeks.** For incoming new PreK and Kindergarten students, the first placements will take place by Friday, April 15.
- **When class sizes get to be 16**, we will evaluate how many more students are unplaced and work to balance class sizes across the three schools in the District.
- **The District will work to keep families/siblings together.**
- If a family has **special considerations** for their child for the District to take into account, including school placement and needs of the child, there is a section in the registration form to note this for consideration.

We look forward to welcoming new students and their families into our schools, particularly the Class of 2037 (next year's PreK students) and the Class of 2036 (next year's Kindergarten students)!

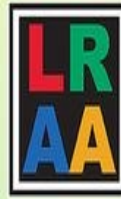





Dunkin' Donuts underwent a complete make-over in 2011, and Sanel Auto Parts (Sanel Napa since 2018) relocated to South Main Street from New Salem Street in the early 1980s. 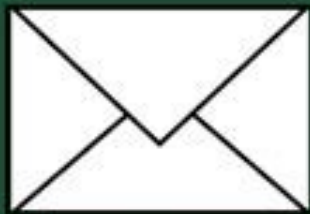

## The Concord-Laconia Connector connects the Lakes Region to southern NH CAT Launches New Commuter Bus Route – the Concord-Laconia Connector

Have you heard? Concord Area Transit started running the Concord-Laconia Connector intercity commuter bus route last month. This service is offered fare-free connecting Concord to Franklin, Tilton, and Laconia.

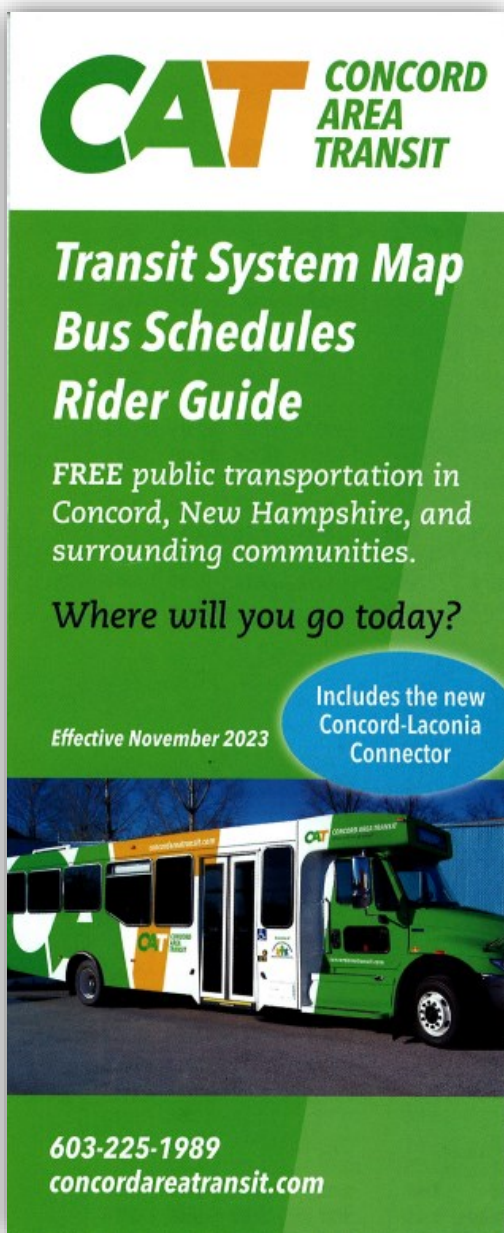
The Concord-Laconia Connector (CLC) has 15 bus stops along the route, including major employment, medical and retail destinations such as Merchant's Way, Merrimack County Complex (Nursing Home and County Corrections), Franklin Industrial Park, J. Jill Distribution Center, Tanger Outlet, Belknap Mall, Concord Hospital-Laconia, and downtown Laconia.

The bus makes four round trips per day with the first leaving downtown Concord at 5:45 AM arriving at Concord Hospital-Laconia at 7:26 AM and the Church St parking lot downtown Laconia at 7:31am.

Terri Paige, Transportation Director for Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack which operates CAT, says "We are very excited about this new route. It gives residents of these communities access to thousands of jobs, while also providing a way for residents to travel to medical appointments and other services outside their home community. And since it is fare free, it will give them a much-needed break from the cost of driving".

Those using the CLC connects to the existing CAT routes via the Penacook Route in Penacook. The routes are timed for a quick, easy transfer at the Penacook Family Physicians bus stop.

Since 1989, Concord Area Transit (CAT) has served Concord area residents and visitors as the public transportation service with regular fixed-route bus service and specialized services for seniors and ADA complementary paratransit service. It provides bus service throughout Concord and surrounding points, including Penacook, Concord Hospital, Downtown, Memorial Field, Fort Eddy Road Plaza, NHTI and Concord Heights. Buses operate Monday through Friday, 6am-6:30pm. No ticket or cash is needed as all services are fare-free. ## Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction Awards \$609,700 to 63 Nonprofits

*Distribution luncheon offers nonprofit leaders time to connect, collaborate*

The Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction recently distributed \$609,700 in grants to 63 area nonprofit organizations at a luncheon at the Huot Career and Technical Center.

The 63 nonprofit leaders accepted their checks during the meet-and-greet event that also offered nonprofit leaders the chance to collaborate and share challenges and strategies over a lunch prepared by students at the center.

"We were glad to see everyone enjoying this celebration of their successes, feeling grateful not only for their grant but for the chance to gather with other nonprofit leaders and share stories and ideas," said Jennifer Kelley, the auction's executive director. "It was a great opportunity for everyone."

Grants will be used by the nonprofit organizations to fund wide-ranging programs that support local children and families in need. These initiatives address needs that are vital to the well-being of children in area communities, including food and housing insecurity and related emergency assistance; childcare and afterschool programs, recreation, education and the arts; family resources; and healthcare, including mental health support, victim outreach and support, and preventative health and wellness training.

The auction's board president, Doug Morrisette, is pleased with the process the organization uses to determine grant eligibility. "We have a Distribution Committee that works tirelessly over many months to review grant requests, and these committee members also look at the health of each organization and its past use of funding to ensure that every dollar the auction grants has impact," Morrisette said. "We are confident that funds we raise and distribute significantly work to improve the lives of local children and their families by ensuring their basic needs are met, and they have opportunities to thrive."

Cindy Hemeon-Plessner, chair of the Distribution Committee, said, "The committee is charged with problem-solving, analysis, empathy and community awareness, so we can assure all who donate, bid and volunteer that the funding is being spent wisely."

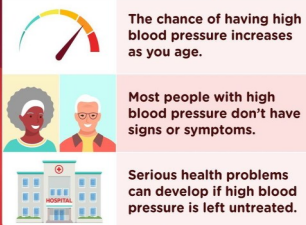
