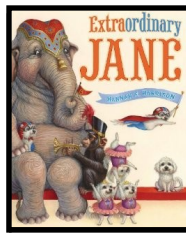
WHS/LHS GRADUATE AUTHORS FIRST BOOK



LHS 1997 graduate, Hannah (Smith) Harrison has illustrated and published her first children's book, "Extraordinary Jane," which was released this month.

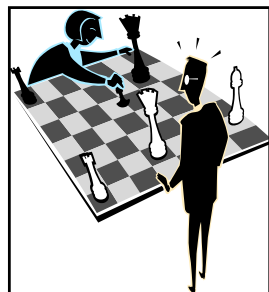
She said that she fell in love with writing in elementary school where former art teacher, Marlene Witham, recognized her early talents

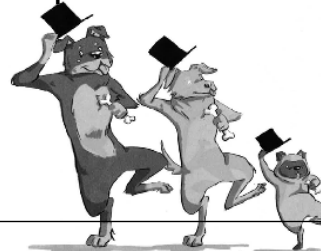

TEENS AND STRESS

TUESDAY, Feb. 11, 2014 (Health Day News) -- If paying the bills and putting food on the table put adults' nerves on edge, just imagine how today's over-scheduled, frequently tested teenagers must feel.

Adolescents reported stress levels during the school year that surpassed those of adults, according to the American Psychological Association's latest *Stress in America* survey.

The survey, based on an August 2013 Harris Interactive poll, is thought to be the first to focus on how stress is affecting the nation's adolescents. It included more than 1,000 teens and nearly 2,000 adults. The findings suggest that teens' sleeping and exercise habits feed into their stress levels and the stress affects their health habits, creating a vicious circle, said Norman Anderson, CEO and Executive Vice-President of the American Psychological Association.



So if you are looking for a way to reduce your teen's stress, check out one of the area's several yoga studios — yoga offers many health benefits and develops flexibility, strength and balance, all while having fun!

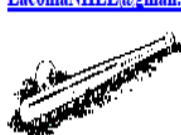

Jonathan Lorentz Quartet Brings Jazz to Next Taylor Community Concert



Taylor Community presents the Jonathan Lorentz Quartet for the next performance in its 2014 Music Series Sponsored by Bank of New Hampshire. The quartet includes Lorentz on saxophone; Chris Mega, piano; Scott Kiefner, bass and Scott Kinison, drums. The concert is scheduled for Sunday, March 9 at 3 pm in Taylor's Woodside Building.

Lorentz comes to the music arena first and foremost as a practicing artist who consistently reminds his band-mates and audiences that it's not just about the performers, but the musicians and the audience together. "That's where the music lives!" he says. This outlook has helped grow the live music scene in New Hampshire since his arrival in 2011. He has started a jazz music series in eight separate locations since that time, garnering praise from *Downbeat*, *Jazz Times*, *NH Magazine*, *the Hippo Press* and New Hampshire Public Radio.

The saxophonist's album "Borderlands" was released to critical acclaim in 2010, and receives airplay on radio programs throughout the world.

4. Green Card and insurance form given to you by your employer if you have access to health insurance through your job.

For the past two weeks Laconia Firefighters have been conducting intensive rescue drills at the Central Station. Lt. Desrosiers and Firefighter Brad Hardie are teaching the classes to the on-duty firefighters. Each shift is getting about 7 hours of classroom and intense physical training on how to self-rescue from burning buildings.

As part of the drill the firefighters built a prop in the garage area that simulates a second floor bedroom window. The firefighters are doing

head first bail outs onto ladders as well as bail outs using a rope system. The training is needed to protect the firefighters in the event they get caught in a rapidly spreading fire. Often firefighters have to go above a fire to search for occupants. The fire below can spread quickly and possibly force drastic measures such as the bail out. The prop will later be used to simulate rescuing a victim from a bedroom and pulling them out through the window and down a ladder. It's a great prop that has a multitude of uses and is not weather dependent, and if we damage it we don't have to worry about upsetting the owner of the building.
