
SUMMER READING EVENTS

EVENING NONFICTION BOOK GROUP


"TRAVELS WITH GEORGE" BY NATHANIEL PHILBRICK

MYSTERY BOOK CLUB


"A HOUSE OF GHOSTS" BY W. C. RYAN

"THE GIRL WITH THE LOUDING VOICE" BY ABI DARÉ



SMOKY MUSHROOM FRITTATA

RECIPE CORNER



From "5 Ingredients: Quick & Easy Food" by Jamie Oliver – find it upstairs at **641.555 Oli!**

Serves 4 | Total 24 Minutes

4 rashers of smoked bacon

14oz mixed mushrooms

8 large eggs

3oz cheddar cheese

1 3/4oz arugula

Preheat the oven to 400F. Slice the bacon and fry in 1 teaspoon of olive oil in a 10-inch non-stick ovenproof frying pan on medium heat for 2 minutes. Add the mushrooms, tearing up any larger ones. Season with sea salt and black pepper; then fry for 5 minutes, or until golden, tossing regularly.



Lightly beat the eggs, then pour into the pan and bomb over nuggets of cheese. Transfer to the oven for 10 minutes, or until nicely set. Loosen the edges with a spatula, then slide onto a board. Dress the arugula in a little extra olive oil and red wine vinegar, and sprinkle on top.

BEGINNER MINDFULNESS MEDITATION



100 CLASSIC NEW ENGLAND HIKES






