AUGUST AT YOUR LIBRARY

A Month of Music at Laconia Public Library

On Wednesday, August 7 at 6pm, blind songwriter, guitarist and poet **Mike Rogers** will present scenes and characters in his life of seventy-five years in “**Outside Looking In**”. Mike has been on the road from coast to coast, New England and the Caribbean. “Outside Looking In” is laced with Mike's wry humor and paints portraits of people "outside the circle" in song, story-telling and poetry. Sometimes edgy, sometimes gentle, his characters are all real people from his journey through life and he places emphasis on understanding and accepting others.

Mike accompanies himself on his guitar and his signature harmonica. He has

been performing for over 45 years and has recorded on more than 40 albums. He has opened for Emmy Lou Harris, Tom Rush, The Eagles, James Montgomery and others. Mike and his wife, Beverly, represented Maine and Georgia at the 1999 International Very Special Arts Conference in Los Angeles and his folk group, Salt River, represented Maine at the New England Artists Conference in 2000. All are welcome to join us in the Laconia Public Library's Auditorium for this performance.

On Thursday, August 8 at 6pm, **Jordan Tirrell-Wysocki**, an award-winning fiddler/singer, will perform "**Songs of Emigration**" at the Laconia Public Library. Through traditional music Jordan Tirrell-Wysocki relays some of the adventures, misadventures, and emotions experienced by Irish emigrants. He will share songs about leaving Ireland, sometimes focusing on the reasons for leaving, sometimes revealing what happened upon arrival, and sometimes exploring the universal feeling of homesickness of a stranger in a strange land. Jordan Tirrell-Wysocki will also discuss the historical context of these songs, interspersing their stories with tunes from Ireland that made their way into New England's musical repertoire, played on his fiddle or guitar.

Jordan Tirrell-Wysocki has toured nationally with bands in various genres, performed across Ireland, and released multiple recordings of Celtic music that can be heard on radio stations around New England and in the British Isles. He has also written soundtracks for audiobooks and television (including the New England Emmy-nominated theme music for NH Chronicle) and appeared as a guest on over 75 albums. Before the pandemic he performed around 200 shows each year, mostly with his own band, the Jordan TW Trio. In 2013 He was awarded the title of "Master Artist" by the NH State Council on the Arts and named "Best Fiddler 2016" by NH Magazine. His lifelong passion for history helps bring to life the traditional music around which he built his career. This free program is made possible by New Hampshire Humanities. 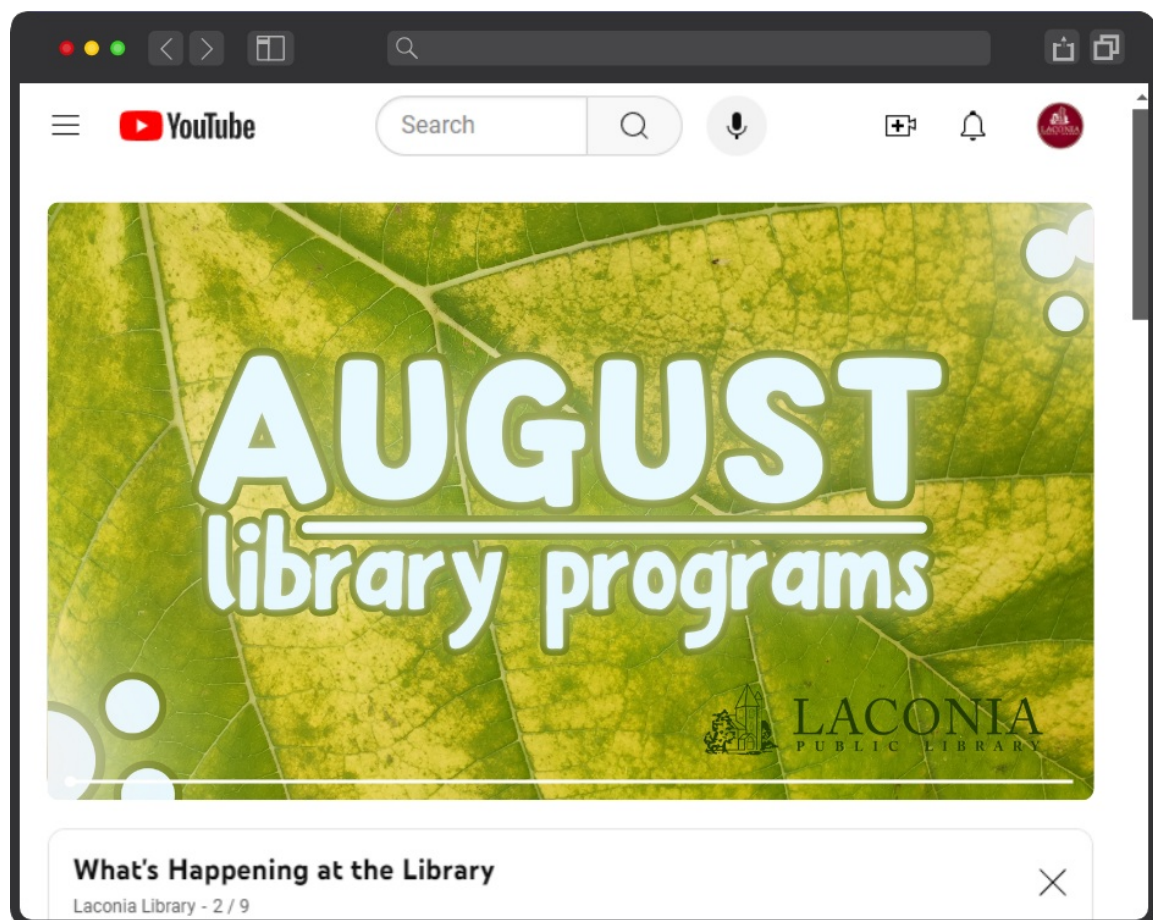
Last Chance for Summer Reading Prizes in the Laconia Children's Room!
