VOTER INFORMATION


For the Primary Election:

Voters who are Undeclared (aka Independent) may participate in this election. When checking in at the polling location, these voters can choose to take either a Democrat or Republican ballot. When exiting the polls, it is advised to check with the election workers before leaving the polls to change back to Undeclared if you want to avoid having your party affiliation changed to Democrat or Republican. Any voters who are already declared as a Democrat or Republican will automatically be provided with that party's ballot when checking in at their polling place.

Are you unsure of your party affiliation? Just log onto the Secretary of State's website [here](#) to find out.

Please note that the last day to change your party affiliation was on June 4, 2024.

The Laconia City Council will hold two consecutive Public Hearings on Monday, August 26, 2024, during the regular City Council meeting which begins at 7:00pm at City Hall, [45 Beacon Street East, Laconia New Hampshire 03246](#). Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds are available to municipalities through the NH Community Development Finance Authority. Up to \$500,000 annually is available for Economic Development Projects, up to \$500,000 for Housing Projects, up to \$500,000 for Public Facility Projects, up to at least \$350,000 in Emergency Funds, up to \$25,000 per Planning Study grant. All projects must directly benefit a majority of low- and moderate-income persons. The Public Hearings will comment on the following:

1. A proposed application to the Community Development Finance Authority for up to \$25,000 in CDBG Planning Study Grant Funds. Of the grant funds, up to \$3,500 will be retained by the City for administrative costs associated with the project, up to \$21,500 of the funds will be subgranted to Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack (CAPBM). CAPBM proposes to make improvements to the Laconia Senior Center kitchen, [184 Beacon W St Laconia](#), that would allow them to provide daily congregate meals and expand program opportunities. The CDBG Funds would assist with pre-development of the project including pre-construction planning, preliminary architectural design and capital campaign planning costs.
2. The Anti-displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan for the Merrimack-Belknap Community Action Program Study.

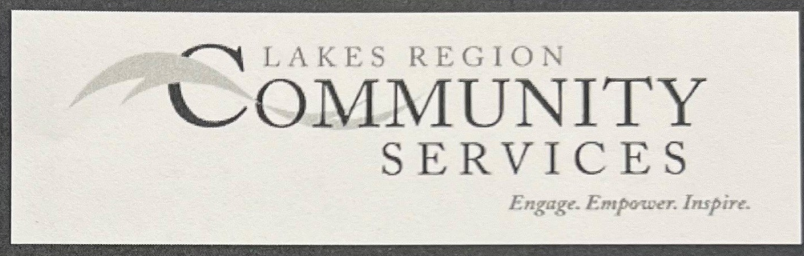

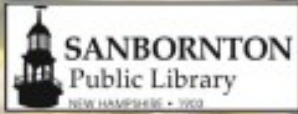

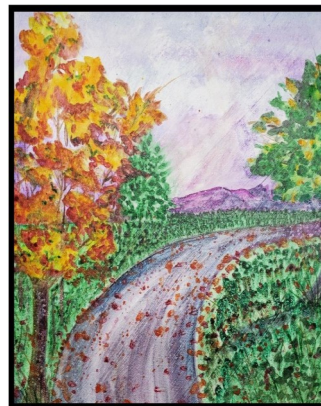

THEN ...

Ladder wagon of the Laconia Fire Department and firemen in dress uniforms parade through Depot (now Veterans) Square in the early 1900s. In background, at far left, a wooden house containing a grocery store occupies the site of The Laconia Tavern, built in 1913. Immediately to left of the Peoples (later Evangelical Baptist) Church, at right, the 1908 Baldi Block is glimpsed. Tracks of the Street Railway run through the square, next to the fire apparatus. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Tavern operated as a hotel, with restaurant, coffee shop and meeting rooms, from 1913 to late 1969, when it was converted to affordable housing. The wooden building on the corner of Main Street was long home to a grocery store, including Emanuel's Quality Market, and more recently to a number of other businesses. The Evangelical Baptist Church became 'The Holy Grail,' a restaurant, from 2015-2017 and is now 'The Chaos & Kindness Experience,' or 'CAKE.' (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)

FBCOs can also be a tremendous resource for communities when properly included in local emergency preparedness plans.

Emergency and Safety Planning Fundamentals

This session presents the basics of creating an Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) wherein, with training and practice, FBCOs can create safe places to gather and ensure effective response procedures and resources during times of emergencies and/or disaster.

Active Threat Preparation and Response

FBCOs are considered "soft targets" in today's sometimes violent world. Preparing for and responding to active threats (hate crimes, weapons, disruptive people) involves teaching, planning, and exercising. This session will help participants maintain and use situational awareness and effective response to their fullest, helping to potentially save lives and reduce injury.

Silent Disco Party at Beans and Greens to Benefit Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction

Beans and Greens will host a Silent Disco Party in its Notch Biergarten, 245 Intervale Road, on Thursday, August 29 at 7 p.m., with doors opening at 5 p.m.

The event costs \$25 and is a benefit for the Greater Lakes Region Children's Auction.

A silent disco is a dance party at which attendees listen to music through wireless headphones instead of speakers. Headphones are provided by the party's sponsor, and a radio transmitter broadcasts the music, which is picked up through the headphones worn by participants.

Silent discos can be similar to club nights or birthday parties, but they allow for different music channels to play at the same time, on three different channels, so people can choose music that suits their taste. For example, a silent disco might have 60s music for grandparents, 80s music for parents and house music for others, all playing simultaneously; headphones light up in different colors, depending on the channel, so groups always know what channels their friends are on.

"It is super fun, and it will help us support children and families and Beans and Greens is a perfect venue for this event," said Auction Executive Director Jennifer Kelley.

Chris Collias, owner of Beans and Greens, said, "When we bought the farm stand in 2021, we envisioned Beans and Greens as a place where the community could meet, and supporting local causes is a huge part of our mission. 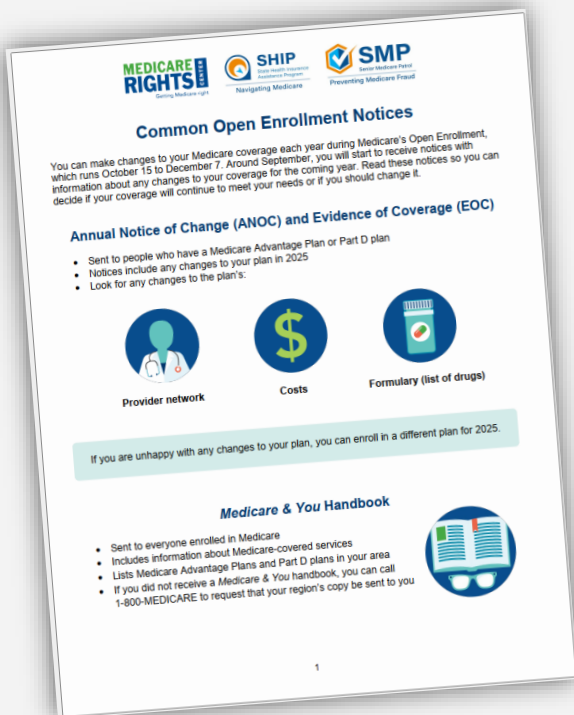
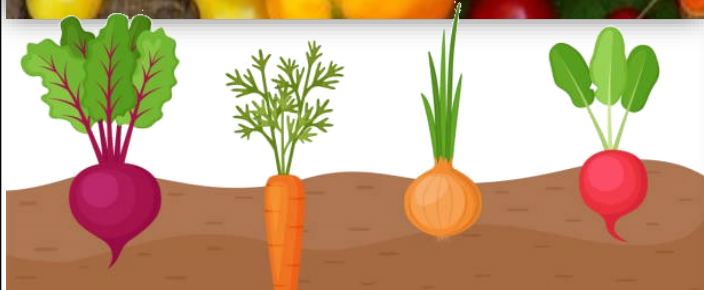

HOW:

Type 911 in the 'To' field

Type short description of the emergency (no pictures, videos, emojis or group texts)

Type exact location of the emergency

Answer 9-1-1 call taker's questions

Be brief and concise - Follow instructions

WHEN:

If you are deaf, hard of hearing or have a speech disability

If you cannot speak due to an injury or medical condition

If you are in a dangerous situation and it's not safe to call

If you cannot make a call because of poor cellular service

If your battery is low

- Do not send images or videos
- Do not send your 911 emergency in a group text - we won't receive it
- A text or data plan is required to text 911
