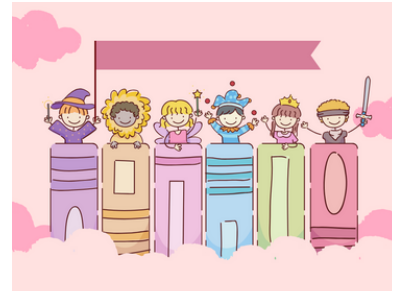


PRESCHOOL PALS

Stop by the Selig Storytime Room to create a snowman ornament using air dry clay! All supplies will be provided in this craft.

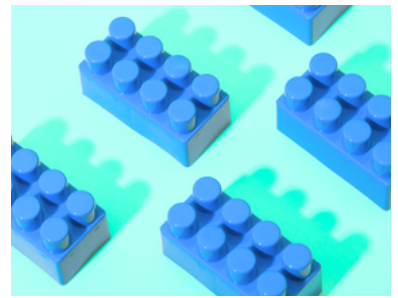

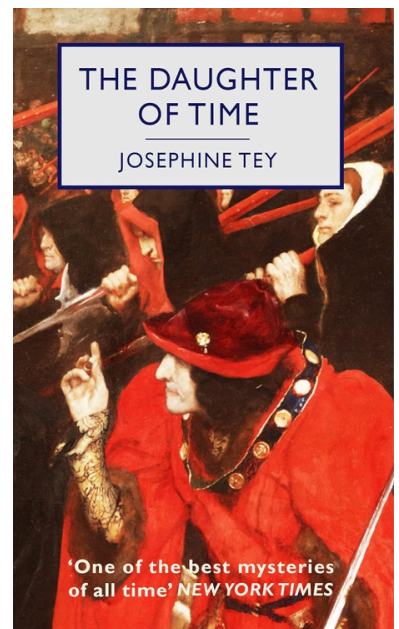
MYSTERY BOOK CLUB "THE DAUGHTER OF TIME" BY JOSEPHINE TEY

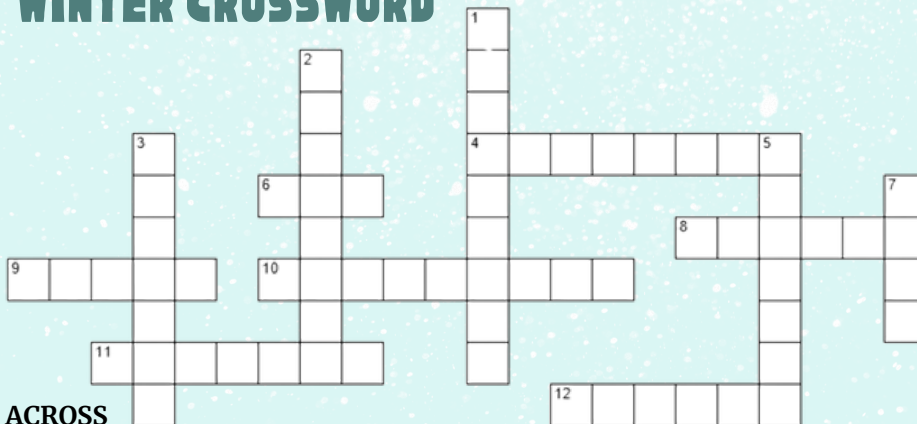
