

**Introduction to Home Cheesemaking**  
Saturday 10 am-1 pm \$35 (Non-Members); \$20 for Members  
This hands-on workshop will cover the basics of how to make simple, delicious cheese in your own kitchen. We will cover equipment, supplies, and basic techniques used to make most types of cheese. Each participant will take part in making a batch of fresh mozzarella, ricotta, and paneer which will take from start to finish in the class. Participants will take home instructions and a set of ingredients (minus the milk) to make a batch or two at home.

Laconia Residents may also bring them to the designated area in the parking lot at the end of Memorial Park Drive (near its intersection with West St.) by Memorial Park, which is available every day. Christmas trees may also be taken to the Brush Dump on Hilliard Road. The Brush Dump is open Friday and Saturday from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm unless it snows. If you've ever wanted to try ice fishing, why not take advantage of New Hampshire's winter free fishing day on **Saturday, January 18, 2025**. That's a day you can fish without a license in New Hampshire!


This annual winter event takes place on the third Saturday in January each year. New Hampshire also offers a free fishing day on the first Saturday in June. Persons participating in a fishing tournament must still hold a license on free fishing day, however.

The New Hampshire Fish and Game Department is the guardian of the state's marine, fish, and wildlife resources and their habitats. Visit [www.wildlife.nh.gov](http://www.wildlife.nh.gov) to learn more.

Make sure each tire is filled to the vehicle manufacturer's recommended inflation pressure, which is in your owner's manual and on a label located on the driver's side door frame. Do not inflate your tires to the pressure listed on the tire itself. That number is the maximum pressure the tire can hold, not the recommended pressure for your vehicle.

- Inspect your tires at least once a month and before long road trips.
- It's best to check the tires when they're cold, meaning that they have not been driven on for at least three hours.
- Check each tire's age. Some vehicle manufacturers recommend replacing tires every six years regardless of use.
- An inspection is not just about checking tire pressure and age. Remember to check for any damage or conditions that may need attention, the tread and sidewalls for any cuts, punctures, bulges, scrapes, cracks, or bumps. The tread should be at least 2/32 of an inch or greater on all tires; and check your spare tire.
- If you find tire damage, take your vehicle to a tire service professional.

Payment options are: In-person, at the City Clerk's office, the drop box on the side of City Hall, through the mail at PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247, over the phone at 1-855-906-0411 or online at [www.laconianh.gov](http://www.laconianh.gov)

Please note there is a fee of 3.25% for all credit/debit card transactions and a \$0.40 fee for all ACH transactions that are done online. There is a 2.99% fee for all credit/debit card transactions done at the counter in City Hall.

## 2024 Cooperator of Year

The Belknap County Conservation District (BCCD) and the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Districts have selected Petal Pushers Farm, a Laconia based garden center, as their 2024 Cooperator of the Year.

A Cooperator is a private citizen, business, or municipality that implements conservation practices in partnership with the United States Department of Agriculture – Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS) and their affiliates, such as BCCD.

Petal Pushers Farm was awarded Cooperator of the Year for their participation in growing crops for the NH Gleans-Belknap County food donation program administered by BCCD, and their use of agricultural best management practices that extend the growing season in a way that conserves water and maintains healthy soils.



# Our yesterdays

## THEN ...

**Bank Square, Laconia,** is seen in the 1950s at holiday time, looking south toward the Winnipesaukee River. The Laconia Spa is still located at the corner of Mill Street, at left, with Lee's Cut-Rate beyond it and, in the distance, the so-called 'Lower Bank' is glimpsed. ## ... AND NOW

**The Spa** relocated to Church Street in 1957, to make way for expansion of Laconia National and City Savings banks. Large wooden building, at right in the 'then' photo, along with the former Newberry store beyond it, was removed in 1963 to make way for a drive-up bank facility. Remaining buildings at left and right were razed during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s, with the exception of the Citizens Bank branch, at left, which was built in 1939 as a First National grocery store. ## THEN...

**Texaco Station at the River Street end of the Church Street Bridge, Laconia, seen here in 1956, was built in 1930-1931 for Rosario Labbe and was later operated by Richard J. Perry for 20 years, then Howard K. Ballou, Goodwin & Fitzpatrick, Tom's Saw Shop for a while and, finally, Bedard's BP and then Ray's BP station. At the time of its 1931 opening, The Citizen reported: 'Of Spanish architecture, built of brick, cement and steel,' the construction of the building and yard required 800 bags of cement, a carload of sand, and two carloads of crushed rock; and about 420 pounds of copper were used for flashing and gutters.' All this work, by contractor W. M. Bisson, 'was performed in two months during the cold weather, with a 'temporary heated enclosure' erected around the building.
