register your dog!**

Per RSA 466:1 all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the license number issued imprinted, as well as a paper license. The tag issued must be worn on the dog's collar at all times. Please remember that a valid rabies

certificate and proof of inoculation (if applicable) are required to register. For a complete list of statutes pertaining to licensing your dog, please visit the [Chapter 466 Dogs and Cats](#) page.

All dogs need to be registered by April 30th of each year.

Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....

THEN...

Portions of the Folsom-Batchelder House in McGrath Square, Lakeport, dated from the 1760s, when Abraham Folsom settled here, and the community was known as Folsom's Mills. The house and mills were acquired about 1825 by Nathan Batchelder. Later Victorian additions made the structure one of the largest in town. The house was one of those spared during the Great Fire of 1903, which destroyed some 200 structures. In the 20th century, the house was home to Harold Tefft, whose fleet of trucks is seen in this photo, taken from Elm Street looking toward Belvidere Street, in distance at right. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



...AND NOW

The property was purchased by developer Scott Everett in 2022 and torn down. 'Lakeport's Ancient Homes' (published in 1917) notes that a son born in the house 'became an officer in the United States Army and was stationed at San Francisco, in which city Folsom Street was named for him.' In addition, Nathan Batchelder's youngest son, Richard N., also born in that house, 'likewise became an officer in the United States Army and was stationed in San Francisco; he later became Quartermaster General of the Army' and died in Washington, D.C., in 1901. 
