A JOURNEY THROUGH RAIL SERVICE IN THE LAKES REGION .

Frank Judge's passion for railroading began while watching his grandfather's steam engine-driven commuter train arrive at the station in the early 1950s. He became captivated by the railroad during an April 1976 tourist excursion from Laconia to Lincoln.

Frank has since purchased, restored, and operated a wooden 1914 Bangor & Aroostook Railroad caboose on the Wolfeboro Railroad until he relocated to Memphis in 1980 for his career. After returning to New Hampshire in 1986 and acquiring another caboose, his passion for railroading continued to grow.

The Laconia Passenger Station has been a key part of our community's history, serving as a vital transportation hub. Frank will highlight the historical timeline of rail service in Laconia and the evolution of the passenger station.







Winter Driving Can Be Tricky!!



'Five Corners' Market, near the top of Pine Hill, Laconia, is seen in the 1920s, when the proprietors were Joseph Simoneau and Euclide J. Cantin (later, owner of Cantin Chevrolet). The building has had many owners, including Alfred J. Cantin (1930-1940s), Arsene J. Dumais (1950s), Leo L. Bourgault (Leo's Food Center, 1950s-1970s), Thomas Ennabe, Richard Martel (Pine Hill Market, 1980s) and (Tyler Street Market, early 2000s), among others. The business was also known, for a while, as the Pine Hill Beanstalk. (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)

Per RSA 466:1 all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the license number issued imprinted, as well as a paper license. The tag issued must be worn on the dog's collar at all times. Please remember that a valid rabies certificate and proof of inoculation (if applicable) are required to register. For a complete list of statutes pertaining to licensing your dog, please visit the [Chapter 466 Dogs and Cats](#) page.

All dogs need to be registered by April 30th of each year.
