The City has approximately 1,500 streetlights on Eversource electric poles. Most of these poles are wood. Some are tall bare metal aluminum poles. Most of the latter poles are in the downtown area of the City.





Mill Street, Laconia, is seen during World War II, when the Gilbert Clock Co. occupied the Busiel Mill, off-photo at left, behind the office and shipping department, located in the two-story building at left. The four-story wooden factory at center was the Esty Mill (later Sakansky and Gilbert). Part of the Belknap Mill is seen at right. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)

Both the office and shipping department building of the Busiel Mill and the Esty Mill were demolished in mid-1970, during the city's Urban Renewal Program. The former W.D. Huse & Sons factory (later Laconia Needle Co., Beauchaine and Vernitron), faintly visible at top in the 'then' photo, was razed in 2004 for construction of new housing, called Mill View. Per RSA 466:1 all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the license number issued imprinted, as well as a paper license. The tag issued must be worn on the dog's collar at all times. Please remember that a valid rabies certificate and proof of inoculation (if applicable) are required to register. 

A JOURNEY THROUGH RAIL SERVICE IN THE LAKES REGION .

Frank Judge's passion for railroading began while watching his grandfather's steam engine-driven commuter train arrive at the station in the early 1950s. He became captivated by the railroad during an April 1976 tourist excursion from Laconia to Lincoln.

Frank has since purchased, restored, and operated a wooden 1914 Bangor & Aroostook Railroad caboose on the Wolfeboro Railroad until he relocated to Memphis in 1980 for his career. After returning to New Hampshire in 1986 and acquiring another caboose, his passion for railroading continued to grow.


