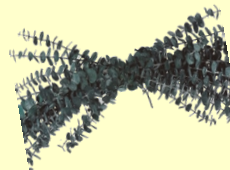

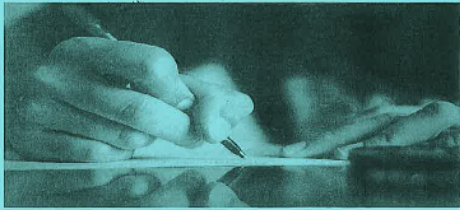

On **Saturday December 14th** from **10-2 pm**, certified counselors will be at the Lakes Region Community College-CAT Building to assist you in signing up for insurance in the Health Insurance Marketplace, either online or using a paper application.

What to Bring:

1. Social Security number or a document number.
2. Employer name and current income for yourself, as well as for anyone else in your household. (You can find this information on a current pay stub or recent W-2 form)
3. If you or anyone else in your household currently has health insurance, you will need information on the insurance, including the current policy number(s).

Laconia Housing Authority Who are we?

Laconia Housing Authority is a quasi-governmental non-profit agency that is affiliated with the City of Laconia but is not a City department. The Authority is governed by a five member Board of Commissioners, each member being appointed by the Laconia City Manager for staggered five year terms. Laconia Housing Authority is not included as part of Laconia's annual operating budget as it is entirely self-supporting through contracts with the federal government and property management and service fees.

Today Laconia Housing owns over 300 units of rental housing in Laconia and surrounding towns. Through a variety of funding mechanisms, the rents at these units are kept affordable to workforce families and to eligible elderly and disabled persons. In addition to housing owned and managed, Laconia Housing also operates the federal Section 8 housing program with over 400 Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV) in the greater Laconia area. Under the HCV program, eligible elderly and family households find decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private rental market and a portion of their rent is subsidized based on their household income and their ability to pay.



Sunrise Towers

The central office of Laconia Housing Authority is located in the Sunrise Towers building at 25 Union Avenue. In addition to the 98 studio, one, and two bedroom units, an array of services are offered to the elderly and disabled tenants on a voluntary basis. The amenities provided include two meals daily, 365 days a year, as well as housekeeping, personal care, and limited nursing services. In addition, a variety of social activities are made available. Although Sunrise Towers houses the office staff of Laconia Housing, most of the nearly 40 full and part time employees spend their day assisting tenants in their activities of daily living, preparing and serving meals, or maintaining Sunrise Towers and the four other projects managed by Laconia Housing Authority.

Winter Driving Tips

Driving in Snow and Ice

The best advice for driving in bad winter weather is not to drive at all, if you can avoid it. Don't go out until the snow plows and sanding trucks have had a chance to do their work, and allow yourself extra time to reach your destination.

If you must drive in snowy conditions, make sure your car is prepared, and that you know how to handle road conditions. It's helpful to practice winter driving techniques in a snowy, open parking lot, so you're familiar with how your car handles. Consult your owner's manual for tips specific to your vehicle.

Driving safely on icy roads

- Decrease your speed and leave yourself plenty of room to stop. You should allow at least three times more space than usual between you and the car in front of you.
- Brake gently to avoid skidding. If your wheels start to lock up, ease off the brake.
- Turn on your lights to increase your visibility to other motorists.
- Keep your lights and windshield clean.
- Use low gears to keep traction, especially on hills.
- Don't use cruise control or overdrive on icy roads.
- Be especially careful on bridges, overpasses and infrequently travelled roads, which will freeze first. Even at temperatures above freezing, if the conditions are wet, you might encounter ice in shady areas or on exposed roadways like bridges.
- Don't pass snow plows and sanding trucks. The drivers have limited visibility, and you're likely to find the road in front of them worse than the road behind.



Don't assume your vehicle can handle all conditions. Even four-wheel and front-wheel drive vehicles can encounter trouble on winter roads.

If your rear wheels skid.

- Take your foot off the accelerator.
- Steer in the direction you want the front wheels to go. If your rear wheels are sliding left, steer left. If they're sliding right, steer right.
- If your rear wheels start sliding the other way as you recover, ease the steering wheel toward that side. You might have to steer left and right a few times to get your vehicle completely under control.
- If you have standard brakes, pump them gently. If you have anti-lock brakes (ABS), do not pump the brakes. Apply steady pressure to the brakes. You will feel the brakes pulse—this is normal.

If your front wheels skid . . .

- Take your foot off the gas and shift to neutral, but don't try to steer immediately. As the wheels skid side ways, they will slow the vehicle and traction will return. As it does, steer in the direction you want to go. Then put the transmission in "drive" or release the clutch, and accelerate gently.

If you get stuck . . .

- Do not spin your wheels. This will only dig you in deeper.
- Turn your wheels from side to side a few times to push snow out of the way.
- Use a light touch on the gas, to ease your car out.
- Use a shovel to clear snow away from the wheels and the underside of the car.
- Pour sand, kitty litter, gravel or salt in the path of the wheels, to help get traction. Try rocking the vehicle. (Check your owner's manual first—it can damage the transmission on some vehicles.) Shift from forward to reverse, and back again. Each time you're in gear, give a light touch on the gas until the vehicle gets going.

Laconia residents can transport and drop-off their tree(s) at the following locations for ultimate disposal by DPW:

1. Hilliard Road Brush Dump on Wednesdays in January (Jan 8th, Jan 15th, Jan 22nd and Jan 29th) from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. An attendant will be there to assist you.
2. Laconia Transfer Station, 385 Meredith Center Road. Monday thru Friday from 7:30 am to 3:30 pm and Saturdays from 8:00 am to Noon. Place trees in the specifically marked/designated area ONLY. PLEASE PULL ON SCALES FIRST!
3. Memorial Park Softball Field off Pearl St (on Memorial Park Drive). Place trees in the specifically marked/designated area ONLY.

The holiday season can be one of the busiest and most exciting times of the year. It's a time when families and friends come together and rejoice by indulging in delicious food and holiday beverages. Because many holiday parties serve alcoholic beverages, it's important that those who are drinking take proper precautions.

Drunk and "Buzzed" Driving

Driving with a Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) level of .08% or higher.

Alcohol's Effects on Driving:

BAC 0.02: Some loss of judgment, relaxation and altered mood.

BAC 0.05: Reduced coordination, reduced ability to track moving objects and reduced response to emergency situations.

BAC 0.08: Poor muscle coordination; self-control, reasoning, and memory are impaired; reduced information processing.

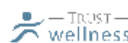
