Preschool Pals is geared toward preschoolers. Join us for singing, dancing, crafting, and of course, reading some great books!



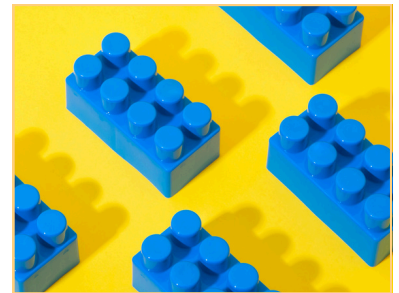

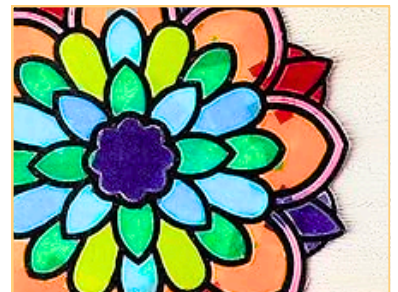

## RECIPE CORNER

### TACO POTATOES

From *Tasty Pride: 75 Recipes and Stories*. Find it upstairs!

1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
2. Using a fork, pierce the potatoes all over. Rub with olive oil and salt. Bake the potatoes directly on the oven rack for an hour.
3. Heat 1tbs olive oil in a skillet over medium-high. Add the onion and jalapeno, season with salt, and cook about 3 mins. Add the turkey, stirring to break apart. Add the taco seasoning and cook until the meat is browned. Add tomatoes and cook for another 2-3 mins. Remove from the heat and stir in the cilantro and lime juice.
4. Remove the potatoes from the oven and let cool slightly. Cut in half lengthwise and scoop out a bit of the centers.
5. Fill the potatoes with the turkey mixture. Top with shredded cheese, guacamole, and sour cream and serve hot.

#### Ingredients

- 4 large russet potatoes
- 1tbs olive oil, plus more to taste
- kosher salt
- 1 medium yellow onion, diced
- 1 jalapeno, seeded and minced
- 1 pound ground turkey
- 1oz taco seasoning
- 3 plum tomatoes, seeded and diced
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro
- juice of 1 lime
- shredded cheese
- guacamole & sour cream

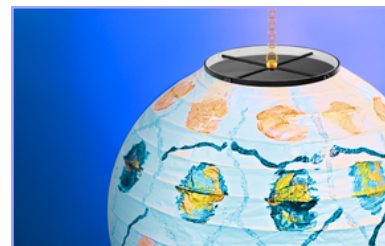

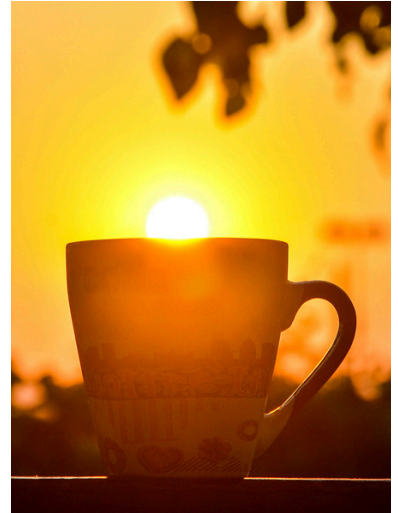
## DEATH CAFÉ

## MYSTERY BOOK CLUB

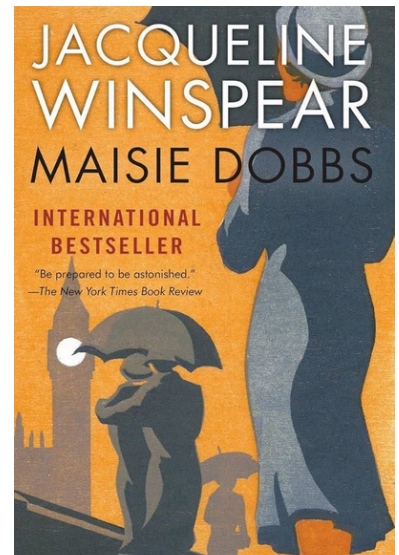
**"MAISIE DOBBS" BY JACQUELINE WINSPEAR**

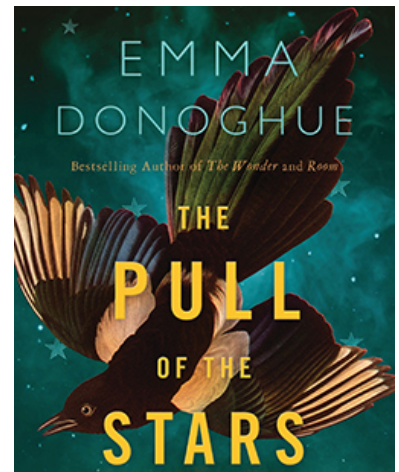
**"THE PULL OF THE STARS" BY EMMA DONOGHUE**

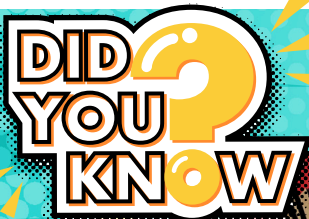
