



News from the Public Works Dept.

CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE: SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective at 6:00 am on Monday, March 10, 2025, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited from using all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#). Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.

One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships







Plastics Recycling and Community Action Program Food Drive Saturday, March 22nd

We are Back!! The Green Sanctuary members of The Universalist Unitarian Society of Laconia, together with the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club members, will be out in front of our little white church at 172 Pleasant Street Laconia from 11am until 1pm on Saturday, March 22nd.

You may bring clean soft plastics and # 6 clean Styrofoam for collection. We cannot accept hard plastic containers. Examples are bread, vegetable bags, news paper sleeves, dry cleaning bags, pellet bags, grocery bags, plastic wrap, postal mailers, bubble wrap, clean liners from inside cereal boxes, wrapping from the inside of, for instance, graham cracker boxes. (If the plastic when crinkled makes a sound, we cannot accept it. An example is fresh grape bags). Help keep these toxic items out of our environment. They will be properly repurposed into decking and furniture.







THEN ...

The Perley Block, at the corner of Hanover and Main streets, Laconia, is seen in 1950 — 75 years ago — just as demolition was beginning in preparation for a modern, new Landau's Department Store. The three-story wooden block was built in 1882 and was home to a number of stores and offices, as well as the Hotel Perley, later renamed the Central House. Among other tenants was the Laconia Chamber of Commerce, in the 1920s, and John's Shoes, prior to 1947, when the latter moved into the Colonial Theater Building, next door. Landau's, which had come to Laconia in 1928, relocated to the Perley Block, June 25, 1948. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

Demolition and construction continued through most of 1950 and Landau's opened its new store, Nov. 2 of that year. In early January 1960, J.J. Newberry took over operation of the Landau store, operating there until April 5, 1997. Former Newberry's Manager Gary Bloom bought the property and opened Bloom's Variety, Sept. 10, 1997, operating the business until July 12, 2008, when it closed. After remaining vacant for a couple of years, the building became home to the Laconia Antique Center in January 2011. (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)
