No storytime on 5/26.



RECIPE CORNER

ALMOND JELLY WITH FRUIT COCKTAIL

From *Chinese Soul Food: A Friendly Guide* by Hsiao-Ching Chou.
Find it upstairs at 641.5951 CHO!

1. In a medium heatproof bowl, combine gelatin and sugar. Set aside.
2. In a small pot over high heat, bring the water to boil. Remove from heat. Add the water to the gelatin mixture and stir until it dissolves. Add the almond extract and milk, and stir to combine. Pour the gelatin mixture into an 8"x8" baking dish and chill for at least 4 hours or up to overnight.
3. To serve, cut the gelatin into cubes and divide it between 4 to 6 bowls. Divide the fruit cocktail and syrup among the bowls of gelatin, and serve.






FICTION BOOK GROUP "THE LION WOMEN OF TEHRAN" BY MARJAN KAMALI
