## A JOURNEY THROUGH RAIL SERVICE IN THE LAKES REGION .

Frank Judge's passion for railroading began while watching his grandfather's steam engine-driven commuter train arrive at the station in the early 1950s. He became captivated by the railroad during an April 1976 tourist excursion from Laconia to Lincoln.

Frank has since purchased, restored, and operated a wooden 1914 Bangor & Aroostook Railroad caboose on the Wolfeboro Railroad until he relocated to Memphis in 1980 for his career. After returning to New Hampshire in 1986 and acquiring another caboose, his passion for railroading continued to grow.

The Laconia Passenger Station has been a key part of our community's history, serving as a vital transportation hub. Frank will highlight the historical timeline of rail service in Laconia and the evolution of the passenger station.

# News from the Public Works Dept.

## CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE: SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective at 6:00 am on Monday, March 10, 2025, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited from using all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#). Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

### Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.

### One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships



## Photography Center Announces Exhibition of Historic Buildings

The New Hampshire Center for Photography and the Belknap Mill invite the public to view its exhibition Survivors: 200 Years of New Hampshire Architecture.

This exhibition celebrates the rich history of architecture found in New Hampshire through a display of over 70 photographs drawn from a record of over 800 images made by NHCP members. All the buildings depicted are 200 years or more in age, and range from simple structures to elegant mansions. Volunteer photographers travelled across the state from the Connecticut River east to the Seacoast, and from Berlin south to the Massachusetts border to include as many cities and towns as possible.

Survivors: 200 Years of New Hampshire Architecture will run from April 3<sup>rd</sup> through April 29<sup>th</sup> in the Riverside Gallery at Laconia's historic Belknap Mill. An Opening Reception will be held on Friday April 4<sup>th</sup> from 5:00-7:00PM, with photographers present to discuss their work or answer questions.

On Saturday April 5<sup>th</sup> at 12 noon, there will be a special presentation by local historian and author Warren Huse about the history and development of the area. Guided tours of historic Belknap Mill will also be available beginning at noon on Saturday. Regular hours of the Riverside Gallery are 12N to 4PM Wednesday through Friday, and Saturday 10AM to 4PM.

The New Hampshire Center for Photography is a non-profit organization that supports the art of photography as a means for creative expression and cultural insight. The organization is devoted to the education and artistic development of its members and communities by providing exhibitions, publications, education, and outreach programs.


## Live-Fire Training

The Laconia Fire Department, with permission from Ladd Hill Investment LLC., has acquired the building located at 1206 Old North Main Street for live-fire training. This training is scheduled for March 31, 2025, and will commence at 9:00 am and conclude at 2:00 pm.

We have obtained the proper permits from the NH Department of Environmental Services and will follow the requirements of the National Fire Protection Agency 1403 – Standard for Live Fire Evolutions.

The purpose of this training is to give our firefighters experience under actual fire conditions. You may see several fire department vehicles operating in the area on the training day. Our goal is to maximize firefighter training with as little disruption to the surrounding area as possible.

# 2025 Curbside Spring Leaf Pickup

During the weeks of April 28 - May 2, and May 12 - May 16 the City's contractor will pick up an additional 10 bags of leaves during these two weeks on your normal trash day. All materials must be placed in paper compost bags.

## CITY OF LACONIA BRUSH DUMP

The Hilliard Road Brush Dump is located at 325 Hilliard Road (603-366-4855). As of April 2nd the facility will now be open on Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 8 am to 3 pm.

Materials accepted are as follows: Clean wood (not painted, stained or pressure treated); branches of trees (no larger than 3" in diameter/3' in length). Leaves are not accepted at the Brush Dump.

Residents who want to use this facility must have a Laconia dump sticker or day pass. Dump stickers and day passes are available at the City Clerk's Office, City Hall, 45 Beacon St. East in Laconia from 8:30-4:30, Monday-Friday. Questions? 


# Our Yesterdays

*Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past...*

## THEN ...

**Rublee's Band appears in front of the Weeks Block in Lakeport Square, in the 1870s, as captured by E.D. Ward, local photographer. The circa 1871 brick block burned, March 9, 1881, but was replaced by the Lakeport Opera House, which opened, March 7, 1882. Several frame houses extend at right, beyond Clinton Street, with the Gilford, Gilmanton and Lake Village Baptist Church seen in the distance. Built as a traditional New England church in 1833, the edifice was razed and rebuilt in the gothic revival style in 1869-1871. A portion of the Osgood Block is glimpsed at right. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)**



## ... AND NOW

**The 1881 Lakeport Opera House was purchased by developer Scott Everett in 2019 and renovated over the next couple of years. The Laconia Daily Sun moved to new quarters on the first floor in April 2020 and Wayfarer Coffee, July 3, 2020. The second-floor stage reopened, June 8, 2021. Just beyond Clinton Street, the Lakeport National Bank building replaced the wooden house in 1917. The third house in the earlier view is still there, although enlarged and considerably changed architecturally. (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)**
