It's that time of the year when many residents and businesses have begun their plans to have their driveways and parking lots repaved. Driveway permits are issued by Public Works, located at 27 Bisson Avenue. Please keep in mind that obtaining your driveway permit is easier if you have everything the City needs to review your request when you come in.

Larger multi-family complexes (greater than duplex) and commercial

property owners must start the permit process at the Planning Department in City Hall to determine if their plans meet City zoning regulations. Please bring a sketch or plans of the existing pavement (if any) and of the proposed pavement. The Planning Department will review the concept to ensure your plans meet the City's green space as well as setback and any other zoning regulations. After ensuring your proposal meets the City's zoning regulations, Planning will notify Public Works that they can issue your driveway permit.

Single family residential and duplex property owners can go directly to the Public Works office to obtain a permit. Please bring a sketch or plans of the existing pavement (if any) and of the proposed pavement. Public Works will review your pavement plan to determine if your plan meets the City's green space and driveway length zoning requirements. Public Works will also review your plan to determine if it conforms with the City's driveway policy. If your plan conforms to the City's driveway policy and meets greenspace and length requirements, Public Works will issue you a permit. If your plan does not meet either zoning regulations or the City's driveway policy, Public Works will explain the next steps that you must take to obtain a driveway permit.



A JOURNEY THROUGH RAIL SERVICE IN THE LAKES REGION .

Frank Judge's passion for railroading began while watching his grandfather's steam engine-driven commuter train arrive at the station in the early 1950s. He became captivated by the railroad during an April 1976 tourist excursion from Laconia to Lincoln.

Frank has since purchased, restored, and operated a wooden 1914 Bangor & Aroostook Railroad caboose on the Wolfeboro Railroad until he relocated to Memphis in 1980 for his career. After returning to New Hampshire in 1986 and acquiring another caboose, his passion for railroading continued to grow.

The Laconia Passenger Station has been a key part of our community's history, serving as a vital transportation hub. Frank will highlight the historical timeline of rail service in Laconia and the evolution of the passenger station.


CITY OF LACONIA BRUSH DUMP

Through her marathon journey, Lindsay aims to raise both funds and awareness for the MDSC, an organization dedicated to promoting the inclusion, acceptance, and extraordinary capabilities of individuals with Down syndrome. The MDSC provides essential resources, advocacy, and education for families, creating a supportive and empowering community.

Lindsay believes in the importance of inclusive opportunities for all families and views the marathon as a powerful platform to advocate for the incredible programs that have made a difference in Nicholas' life and the lives of many others. 




