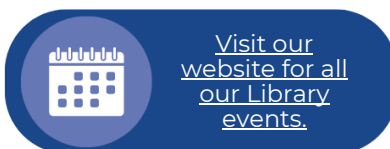

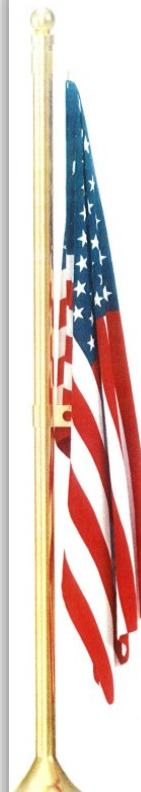

THEN...

Boston, Concord & Montreal Railroad Locomotive 'J.N. Elkins' is seen at Lake Village sometime in the 1870s. (Locomotive was named for the first superintendent of the railroad.) In the background, the brick Weeks Block, built in the 1870s, occupies the site of its later replacement, the Odd Fellows Opera House, built after the Weeks Block burned, March 9, 1881. The Weeks Block — known as the Nixon block after mid-November 1879, when it was purchased by George Nixon — was 'the finest business block in the village.' Occupants included Chocorua Lodge of Odd Fellows, Drs. D.F. and J.C. Moore, the Post Office, a grocery store, variety store and apartments. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The replacement Opera House Block was erected during the summer and early winter of 1881-1882, with the first theatrical performance in the new hall, Feb. 3, 1882. After being used for concerts, plays, graduations and other events for decades, the theater space became a movie theater into the 1950s, with businesses and a post office on the ground floor until the early 2000s. After lying vacant for a number of years, the building was thoroughly rehabilitated in 2019-2021, to include the theater space. (Daniel Sarch/The Laconia Daily Sun)
